rs. Nancy Holmes Dies at Her Home in Salem, Wednesday Morning.

One of the earliest pioneers of Oregon, Mrs. Nancy Holmes, passed away at the home of her son, Hon. W. H. Holmes, in Salem, Wednesday morning, after a long illness, lasting in the acute stage, about six weeks, from a gradual wearing away of the tissues, due to old age after a useful life of 82 years.

Thus is given another reminder of the rapid passing of the honored pioneers of Oregon, those who faced the dangers and endured the hardships and early privations of life on the frontier. Deceased was born in Lincoln county, Missouri, on February 14, 1822, and comes of the sturdy stock of the Porter family, who were prominent Virginians, and who took an active part in the war of 1812. 
