Proposals For Sewer Work.

Sealed proposals will be received at the office of the Auditor and Police Judge of the City of Dallas, Oregon, until May 11, 1904, at 10 o'clock p. m., for the construction of a sewer in Court street from the County road to the County road at the East end of Court street; a sewer in 30th street from the County road to the County road at the East end of Court street; and an outlet sewer from the East end of the above-mentioned Court street sewer at the County road, Northeast to the Lakeview river, in the manner provided by Ordinance No. 30, subject to the provisions of the Charter and Ordinances of the City of Dallas, and the estimates of the City Engineer on file.

Bids will be opened May 21, at 7:30 o'clock p. m., and must be attested in accordance with the terms, which will be turned on application at the office of the Auditor and Police Judge.

Contract must be entered into within ten days after notice of acceptance of bid. And said sewer must be completed on or before September 1, 1904.

No proposals or bids will be considered unless accompanied by a certified check payable to the order of the Mayor of the City of Dallas, in the sum of \$1,000, which shall be returned to the bidder if the bid is not accepted.

SHOWS SUBSTANTIAL GAIN

Registration in Polk County is Heavier Than That of Two Years Ago.

The total registration in Polk County, when County Clerk Loughery closed the books at 5 o'clock Monday evening, was 2534, a gain of 198 over the total registration of two years ago.

The law provides that the books shall be closed on May 15, but as the 15th this year was a nonjudicial day, Polk County followed the lead of many other counties in the state and kept the books open all day Monday.

The above figures show that there are gains this year in 13 precincts and losses in 7. The gains are as follows: Jackson, 21; Salt Lake, 15; Eola, 5; Rickreuil, 12; South Independence, 31; South Monmouth, 4; Luckiamute, 43; East Dallas, 26; South Dallas, 34; North Independence, 22; North Dallas, 6; Rock Creek, 2; Falls City, 64.

The losses are: Douglas, 2; Spring Valley, 5; Buena Vista, 63; Suver, 1; Bridgeport, 3; North Monmouth, 7.

The total registration in Dallas is 578; Independence, 396; Monmouth, 214.

The heaviest gain is in Falls City, and the heaviest loss in Buena Vista.
