County Court Decides to Open Public Highway Between Inde-

pendence and Sidney. Hon. Ed. F. Coad, county judge of

the court of Polk county, and Commissioner William Riddell of the same court, made a careful examination of the route for the proposed route for the Independence-Sidney road, last week, and after examining carefully the matter they decided that the construction of this road is a matter peculiarly in the interest of Polk county, and that it will be built.

This road will open up an immense expanse of country that at present is very difficult of access, and will lead to Independence without the intervening of a hill, the only drawback being the ferry at the river.

The town of Sidney is on the Willamette river on the Marion county side, about six miles above Independence. It is the center of a very valuable district and among other things has a flour mill there that took in 27,000 bushels of wheat last year. In addition to the farming of the cereal class, there are a number of fine hop farms and others of that character.
