RAILROAD WORK IN POLK

Dallas and Falls City Line Is Being Pushed Forward Into the Big Timber.

Active work has been commenced on the four-mile extension of the Dallas the Dallas City Bank in various and Falls City railroad into the big timber west of Falls City. Chief Engineer J. W. The timbers are being sent forward as fast as needed, and work on the extension can now proceed without further

Dallas National Bank Will Open Its Doors Next Monday Morning.
