HOP MARKET STEADIER

T. A. Riggs, of Dallas, Sells Two Hundred Bales at 18 Cents—Like Are Plentiful.

(Tuesday's Oregonian)

More buying pressure, coupled with a growing unwillingness on the part of growers to sell, has had the effect of giving a much steadier tone to the hop market the past few days. The fact that, in spite of all the hammering, prices have not receded argues much for the stability of the market. It is the general belief of growers, and many dealer confess to the same opinion, that the bottom of the 1904 market has been reached and that whatever changes in prices will occur later will be in the upward direction.

Now that orders have begun to come in at market values, it is thought that a business sufficiently heavy may be worked up to clear up all the old stocks remaining, which, when compared with brewing needs, are in significant in quantity. The latest transaction reported was the sale by Riggs, of Dallas, to Jessup of 200 bales at 18 cents. Other recent purchases reported were those of McKinley Mitchell, 51 bales, at 17 cents; Schucking, 62 bales, at 16 cents; Gilbertson, 62 bales, at 16 cents; Lillenthal, 50 bales, at 15 cents, and Seavey & Metzler, 200 bales, at 17 cents. Lachmund is also said to have bought a large lot recently at 15 cents.

T. A. Riggs, of Dallas, who was in the city Monday says that crop conditions, as a whole are not good in his district. While some yards are free from vermin, others are badly infested. He declares that there will be a lot of mold in Oregon hops this year. Hopgrowers are confronted with a new difficulty in the shortage of spraying materials. The supply of quassa chips in the state is about exhausted, as dealers had no idea of the demands that would be made upon them and carried no more than the supply. In many sections of the state quassa cannot be bought for love or money, and the unfortunate growers who have lice in their yards are compelled to use substitutes, the value of which as exterminators is unknown.

A meeting of the stockholders forming the Oregon Hopgrowers' Corporation will be held at Salem on the 20th for the purpose of incorporating the company. Many growers have already signed up their crops, and it is expected that many more will do so as soon as the company has been put on a legal footing.

Much amusement was caused in the trade by a statement printed in a local paper to the effect that Krebs had contracted for his hop crop for five years to the Olympia brewery. When the big output of the Krebs yards and the comparatively limited capacity of the brewery are considered, the absurdity of the statement is apparent.
