May Talk to Tillamook.

Dallas has mutual telephone connection with Toledo, Newport, and other Yaquina Bay points, the line having been completed to King's Valley late last summer, and now there is prospect of early connection with the towns of Tillamook county. A dispatch from Cloverdale in Saturday's Telegram says: "The Cloverdale Telephone Company this week completed ten miles of new telephone line to Sandlake. The company has also lately completed its line to Dolph. This gives Tillamook City telephone connection with every voting precinct in the south part of the county. There is hardly a farmhouse from Tillamook to Slab Creek that has not telephone connection, and it is hoped next year will see the system extended to the valley by way of Willamina. The system now embraces over 60 miles of wire and about 70 phones."
