POPULIST U'REN IS CARELESS

Enacting Clause Omitted from Anti-Pass Law and from All Constitutional Amendments.

Some little excitement was raised around the state capitol Saturday when it was discovered that the anti-pass bill filed under initiative petition by Mr. U'ren of the People's Power League, is without the enacting clause, "Be it enacted by the People of the State," which is prescribed by the constitutional amendment under which this and other laws were initiated.

The other bills submitted by petition for new laws are provided with enacting clauses. It is possible that the courts may hold that so long as the sovereign will of the people is expressed, all defects in manner of submission or other details would be cured. Yet such a decision by the courts would breed carelessness and undigested legislation.

No matter which way the decision goes, it is safe to say that the beginning of endless legal turmoil is here with the advent of law-making by initiative.—Salem Statesman.
