Knowing that there has never been a movement inaugurated in the state that will do so much for our boys and girls, we do not hesitate to urge that you do all in your power during the vacation to encourage the children in their preparation for the exhibits.

The collection and delivery of the exhibits from the different districts will, of necessity, depend upon the district boards of the several districts, and we suggest that this matter be taken up at the annual school meeting and arrangements be made for the installation of the exhibits. It matters not how small your exhibit may be, some prize may be secured by your district or some one from the district. We shall be pleased at any time to give any information that may be desired.

First and second prizes and honorable mention will be given on all of the following exhibits:

- Best Collective District Exhibit of all products made and grown by the boys and girls of the district.
- Best five potatoes.
- Best three ears of corn of each variety sweet corn, field corn and popcorn.
- Best head of cabbage.
- Largest and best pumpkin.
- Best individual collective exhibit of all vegetables.
- Best record of growth of vegetables.

The ladies committee has the work to be done by the girls in hand, and circulars have been issued that will be sent on application.

Many valuable prizes have been offered, a complete list of which will be published in a few days. A \$475 Hobart M. Cable piano will be given for the best collective district exhibit, but the other prizes have not been assigned. The prizes have not been solicited, and any one desiring to give prizes for any exhibit or exhibits should report to the committee or County School Superintendent immediately.
