DALLAS CHEESE FACTORY.

R. Robinson, the well-known cheese manufacturer, will be in Dallas in a few days to make arrangements for resuming operations at his cheese factory at this place.

"I would be pleased to have you make it known to the dairy people in and around Dallas that I shall be in your city in a short time to see what can be done about getting the cheese factory started. This season is going to be the best that the state has ever had in the dairy line.

The probability that the Dallas cheese factory will be operated again this year will be welcome news to the farmers of this vicinity, many of whom have been anxiously awaiting word from Mr. Robinson as to his plans for this season.

The Dallas factory was established last year and was operated during the cheese-making season with a fair degree of success. The industry was new to the farmers at that time, and for the first few months the enterprise received indifferent support.

It is to be hoped that the factory will be operated on a much larger scale this year, as a first-class cheese plant in Dallas will add greatly to the prosperity of the community.
