SKIM MILK FOR LAYERS.

Tests Which Indicate That it Greatly Increases Egg Production. The department of agriculture has received a report from the West Virginia experiment station of a test made to determine the value of skim milk as against water for wetting a feed mash, says American Poultry Journal.

In the first test, which covered 122 days, twenty-two hens fed skim milk laid 1,544 eggs as compared with 996 eggs laid by the twenty-two hens fed mash wet with water.

In the first period of the second test sixty hens fed the skim milk ration laid 862 eggs in thirty-seven days as compared with 632 eggs laid by a similar lot fed no skim milk. In the second period the rations were reversed. The chickens fed skim milk laid 1,220 eggs in fifty-six days as compared with 978 in the case of the lot fed no skim milk.
