Work on the creamery building is being rushed by the carpenters and concrete workers. The high price of butter-fat is causing much rejoicing among the farmers, and the opening of the Dallas creamery is anxiously awaited.

Everyone seems anxious to help the School Fair. Liberal subscriptions of money and prizes were received from the Dallas merchants last week, and a similar hearty reception was given Superintendent Seymour when he visited Falls City in the interest of the exhibition, Tuesday. All the money needed could have been easily raised in Dallas, but as the Fair is a county institution, the committee decided that it would be only proper to give every town and community an opportunity to contribute to its support. The friends of the public schools, remembering the fine exhibit of last year, are all anxious to encourage the young people in making a still better exhibit this year.
