RETURNS FROM KANSAS

Attorney B. F. Jones Prefers Oregon to Any Country He Saw On His Trip.

Hon. B. F. Jones, of Independence, was a business visitor in Dallas yesterday. Mr. Jones arrived home Saturday from Leavenworth, Kansas, where he appeared as counsel in a case in the United States Court. While in Kansas, he spent a few days at his old home in the city of Lawrence, and there visited a brother whom he had not seen for 37 years. He says his native city and the surrounding country have made great growth and development, that portion of the state being largely devoted to fruit raising. "When I left Kansas City 37 years ago, it was a town no larger than Dallas," said Mr. Jones. "Now it has a population exceeding a quarter of a million. Other cities in the middle states have grown in like proportion. Considering this growth in the older and less favored states, just think what a future is in store for the cities and towns of Oregon! I predict that Portland will be a city of 500,000 people in less than 20 years, and that other cities will make a like rapid growth. The people of Oregon do not appreciate what a really wonderful state they have, and they cannot fully realize their advantages until they have taken a trip through the eastern and middle states. Oregon is the banner state of the Union, and the people have hardly begun to develop its wonderful resources."
