

USE OF HEN MANURE.

It is a Valuable Fertilizer For the Vegetable Garden.

Hen manure is something we want to get rid of, and this quite promptly and frequently, says a writer in Farm and Fireside. Once every week or two is none too often for the good of the fowls in hot weather unless we keep the droppings sprinkled with superphosphate or something else that acts as a disinfectant. We also want to make the best possible use of it. If there is any virtue in it we do not want to lose it. I always put the stuff directly on my garden patches here and there as land becomes available for replanting.

Last year early in June I gave my lime bean vines, then small plants, a dressing of hen manure that happened to be left over in barrels from the winter accumulations, putting a small shovelful around three or four plants in the row. This dressing was afterward worked into the soil with the cultivator and hoe, and for some time no visible trace of it has remained except that we saw its marvelous effect in the growth of the vines. I have not often seen such a mass of foliage and long strings of large pods, running from the ground up to the top of the trellis, nor such a mass of bloom.

Since then I have been putting the cleanings of the henhouse on various crops-around tomato vines, cucumber vines, etc.-and always, at least in a favorable (reasonably wet) season, with marked effect. Let me have manure go to waste.

Pigeon Pointers.

When training young birds do not lose sight of the fact that they are not old birds and also that they require greater care.

Few fanciers realize how first class birds are bred. In a year many fairly good birds are produced, but cracker jacks are few and scarce.

Don't be in a hurry to become a big breeder all at once. Go slow. Secure good stock and build up a flock which will command attention whenever it is shown.

Private trade is the best, but the beginner must content himself to ship to the wholesale market until he gets a reputation for good squabs; then he can care for a retail trade.

Eggs or Flesh—Which?

If eggs for market is your object and you are sure you can regularly supply comfortable houses, then one of the Leghorn varieties will suit you.

If you want a good all around bird—hens good layers, cockerels good big roosters at six months and if turned into capons—superior birds at ten or eleven months—then one of the Plymouth Rock varieties will suit you. This is undoubtedly the most popular fowl in the world today. The market characteristic of this breed are round, plump, yellow skin bodies on short legs.

The Best Squabs.

It seems to be the rule that beginners in the squab business have a desire to own white birds, but those that have followed the business for any length of time care little what the color may be so long as the bird produces a light skinned squab. White birds as a rule are not as hardy and do not generally do as well as colored birds. Some of the best squabs are from pure white and colored, red preferred, mated together.

Black Cayuga Ducks.

The Black Cayuga is one of the com-
mon breeds of ducks. Though not as large as the White Pekin, the Black Cayuga is an excellent layer, a great forager and an excellent breeder. Be-

sides, the Cayugas are very hardy, and the saying "Well hatched is half raised" applies fully to it. This breed of ducks should be better known in this country.

A Ration For Chickens.

The most simple ration for small chicks is cracked wheat and meat scraps the first three weeks of the chickens' lives, adding then cracked corn to the two other foods. Green vegetable food is decidedly helpful in avoiding disease in chicks. Temperature, water, pure air, crowding and sturdy stock are subjects attracting the attention of those who desire to avoid disease in young chicks.

Get Rid of the Culls.

When the young stock is sufficiently matured so that it is not difficult to judge the quality the appearance of the flock is much improved by getting rid of the culs at this season. Culks, old or young are not good. They take up room that the other fowls need in order to do well and attain fine development.

Food Hoppers For Fowls.

With good food hoppers well supplied with dry mash and a good grain ration you would only need to go to the house once a day to gather the eggs and see that everything is all right, and one good man could take care of four or five thousand birds housed and cared for in that thousand.
