RULES AND REGULATIONS

Which Will Govern the Polk County Poultry Show to be Held in Dallas December 26, 27, 28.

I. Entries must be made upon blanks furnished by the Secretary. Entry fees will be on single birds, 25 cents. All birds must be entered singly, and when competing for prizes, an extra fee of 50 cents must be paid. Entries without fees will not be received. No one will be allowed to bring birds into the show room to be offered for sale, unless entry fees have been paid thereon.

II. All entries positively close at 5 o'clock P. M., December 24. All birds must be in the show room by 9 o'clock A. M., December 26. Birds will be received on and after the 24th. All crates and coops must be addressed to J. E. Beeley, Secretary, Dallas, Polk County, Oregon, and Express Prepaid.

III. During the exhibition, the Superintendent shall exercise full control over all exhibits, and none shall be removed from the show room without his consent.

IV. The Association will not be responsible for any loss that may occur, but all specimens assigned to the Association will receive attention from intelligent and careful attendants, and all possible pains taken to prevent loss or damage, that specimens may be returned to the owner at the close of the exhibition. Exhibitors need not necessarily accompany their entries.

A watchman will be in attendance day and night.

V. See that your name and address is plainly marked on every coop shipped by you, and that the leg band numbers of the fowls in each coop are marked on the coop or card, so that the same birds may be returned to their respective coops.

All birds must have leg bands, and the band numbers plainly marked on the entry blanks. Intending exhibitors not having leg bands on their birds may procure same from the Secretary by enclosing with entry fee 5 cents per band for the number needed.

VI. When birds arrive, they will be fed, watered and weighed, and weights posted on coops. No decorations will be allowed on coops until after awards are made, and no score cards of previous winnings shall form part of decorations.

VII. This show will be judged by the score card, and the score card posted on the coop containing the specimen. The decision of the Judge shall be final after the score card has been signed by the Judge and the Secretary.

VIII. All protests against awards, etc., must be made in writing and delivered to the Secretary within twenty-four hours after the awards have been announced for that class, and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$5; and if, after the matter has been thoroughly investigated, it should prove to be without foundation, the deposit will be forfeited.

IX. Should birds be entered and not shown, the fees for same will be forfeited to the Association.

X. Birds will be fed and cared for and transported to and from the depot by the Association.

Exhibitors desiring to dispose of their specimens, but unable to attend the exhibition, may give their price in the entry, to be sold by the Secretary. If sold, the full amount of such sale will be remitted to the exhibitor at the close of the show. No commission will be charged on sales, and exhibitors present are expected to attend sales of their own specimens. The Secretary must be notified of every sale or transfer, otherwise birds will be returned to the original shipper.

XI. Diseased birds will not be allowed in the show room.

XII. For the purposes of this exhibition, the term "Cock" shall be a male hatched previous to 1907; "Cockerel," a male hatched in 1907; "Hen," a female hatched previous to 1907; "Pullet," a female hatched in 1907. A "Fen" shall consist of a male and four females.

XIII. The latest edition of the American Standard of Perfection will be the guide of the Judge in awarding prizes on all the varieties recognized therein. Other varieties will be judged by their club standard or comparison.

XIV. Exhibitors whose entry fees amount to \$2 will be furnished with a non-transferable season ticket, and these tickets will be forfeited if presented by anyone but the owner.

XV. The Executive Committee reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard thereto.
