Monthly School Report.

County School Superintendent H. C. Seymour submits the following report of the schools of Polk County for the month ending November 29: Number of days taught during the month, 18; whole number of days attendance, 37,287; whole number of days absence, 3018; whole number of pupils tardy, 554; number of pupils neither absent nor tardy, 1164; average number of pupils enrolled, 2339; percent of attendance, 92; visits by parents, 71; visits by members of the school board, 34. The entire number of pupils registered in Polk County since the beginning of the present school year is 2432, of which 1253 are boys and 1189 girls.

The midwinter vacation of Dallas College commenced Saturday, and the majority of the students living outside of Dallas have already gone to their homes, leaving about the dormitory and the college building a general atmosphere of desertion and desolation, such as one sees through the dull months of the summer. The work in the various departments of the college will not be resumed until Thursday, January 2, giving the students a rest of nearly two weeks from the routine of study.
