DALLAS. When They Are Behind. With pigs coming at several times

of the year it is not easy to prevent some of the larger ones from having the advantage. These robust fellows look out for themselves; they have their share and more. Of course the big ones should be kept away from the smaller ones-that is admitted. when we give all the plgs considerable range how large a farm will It take for one or two hundred pigs born during half a dozen months of the year that each may have its share of the land, the shade and the water? We cannot work it out in this way as we would like to do; consequently some pigs are behind the rest. They are cuffed and abused occasionally. We allow them to creep into an inclosure for their feed which the big fellows cannot enter. If they fall behind and do not grow as they should, we shut them up for a week or two and feed them skim mlik and other things they like. They should not stay in too long or they may take the thumps. The change of diet and freedom from molestation are good for them. It is not advisable to doctor these pigs with stale buttermilk. This advice is given free, says a writer in Farmers Advocate. Food For Ducklings.

The proper food for young ducklings depends upon their age. When from one to five days old they need boiled egg and breadcrumbs finely chopped. After that age meal, preference given to oatmeal, and middlings in like proportion until they are three to four weeks old. Then grain in their water.

The Scratching Shed. A scratching shed should be built tight so that the fowls are sheltered from the wind. The south side should be open or, on very cold days, covered with light muslin or other thin cloth.

Cottonseed Meal For Cows.

Professor John Michels of Clemson college, South Carolina, claims that when the health of cows is unfavorably influenced by cottonseed meal it is in all probability due to one or more of the following causes: (1) Feeding the meal in conjunction with unsuitable roughage, (2) feeding it in a stale or musty condition and (3) feeding it in excessive quantity. The composition of cottonseed meal and wheat bran shows the former to be more than twice as rich in nutrients as the latter.




