

**THE DAIRYMAN.**

The ideal way to deliver milk is in bottles, but this is true only when the bottles have been properly treated. Bottles when filled are left at hundreds of houses and in some cases enter sickrooms or are washed in the same pans with dishes from sick-rooms. They are frequently used by the servants to hold all kinds of mixtures and sometimes are carried open through dusty streets and stored in dusty rooms. It is absolutely wrong to fill any bottle with milk without first washing it thoroughly and subjecting it to live steam for at least ten minutes.

It should be kept cool and sweet until fed.
