That the country is all right, that traffic conditions are as good as could be expected and that the railroads have no complaint to make, is the statement of Henry Blakeley, general western freight agent for the Northern Pacific. Mr. Blakeley says things look brighter In his opinion it will only be a short time until no complaint is heard anywhere; in fact, he is quite well satisfled with traffic conditions right now. "There is more business in the coun-

try now than there was in 1906," said Mr. Blakeley. "No complaint was heard then, for everybody was happy. The traffic carried now is considerably over that of 1906 and 1905.
