When the poultry is confined, and particularly during the winter months, meat scraps or other animal food should be provided to take the place of the insect life which they feed upon extensively during the spring, summer and fall months.

A young man's chief and most valuable asset as he starts out in life are honesty, sobriety and piety. If a fellow has these traits, he will win out under most any circumstances, and if he doesn't he surely has a rocky and disappointing row to hoe.

It is quite likely more a matter of an available food supply than a certain degree of temperature that calls the migratory birds to their northern haunts at the return of spring. They fly north in the fall at the disappearance of insect life and return when it awakens in the spring.

There should be brought into the home along with sacks of flour, flitches of bacon and canned stuff good books and magazines for the maintenance of the intellectual life of the home. Starvation of the higher faculties may not be so immediately noticeable as is a depletion of physical strength, yet the effects are just as disastrous and far-reaching.

The broad tired wagon and the King road drag should go hand in hand in the improvement of the country highways. The use of the narrow tire on roads that have been put in good shape will tend to undo much of the good work which has been done, while the broad tired wagon is a real aid to whatever may have been accomplished along the line of road improvement.

A nearby farmer who for a number of years past has made a specialty of some one product each year last year had fifty acres planted to cabbage. When he had marketed the last carload of the vegetable, he found that he had cleared in the neighborhood of \$50 per acre. The raising of the crop meant to start with a rich soil, clean cultivation and lots of hard work both in the care and marketing of the crop.

The listing of corn—the planting of it in the bottom of a deep furrow and the covering of it deeper as it germinates and grows—is practiced in several transmississippi states and is made necessary in order to make up for a deficient rainfall. Planted in this way the roots of the corn go deep and receive moisture from the subsoil. In other states in the eastern portion of the corn belt the effort of the tiller of the soil is quite often to overcome the handicap of a surplus of moisture.

There has recently been placed in a sawmill at Tacoma, Wash., what is said to be the largest leather belt that was ever made. It is 114 feet long, eight feet wide and three ply thick. It weighs 2,500 pounds, and there were required in its manufacture the hides of 225 large steers. The hides after being tanned were stretched under great tension and cemented to each other under a very heavy pressure, so that there was no need for a stitch or rivet in the whole belt.

Good Methods.

"The idea that great outlay for equipment is necessary to produce clean milk is erroneous. Milk of the best quality may be produced in an ordinary barn if the proper care be taken. The trouble has not been lack of expensive equipment, but lack of clean methods." This brief statement by Illinois dairy authorities simplifies the milk problem immensely.
