Both of the Republican candidates in the present presidential campaign have replied pointedly and effectively to Mr. Bryan's statement of the salient Democratic issue, "Shall the People Rule?"

Mr. Sherman points out the fact that Mr. Bryan has chosen for an issue that which is no issue, for the people always have and always will rule. Mr. Bryan's vaunted and ill chosen "key note" is one of the axioms of our constitutional government.

Judge Taft goes yet further in his reply. 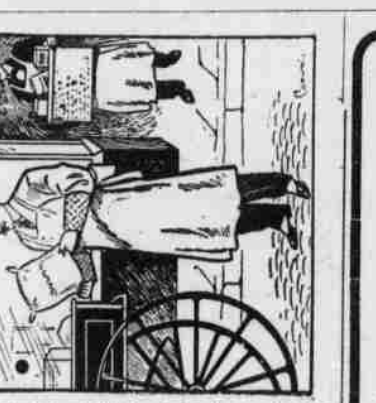
