from his store. A little rapid calcula-
tion of the number of stores in
Dallas and neighboring cities that are
handling the products of the Townsend
creamery, gives one a rather astonish-
ing glimpse into the real importance
of this apparently modest little
industry that has been developed in
our city within only a little more than
a year.

feel over the appearance of her newly

basket had been overturned in it and
conditions seem unfortunately to be
come no better as time goes on.

Of all of the new Initiative and
Referendum laws begotten of the
voters of Oregon at the June election,
none seem to be more actively potent
in stirring up strife and dissension
than the two salmon bills. The first
effect of the passage of these two new
laws was to arouse to an even
greater pitch than ever before, the
animosity between the wheelmen
and the gillnetters on the Columbia
river, but now these two laws,
designed by petty rival fishing
interests to be welded for the mutual
knifing of one another, have gone a
notch farther, and seem destined to
bring about unpleasant relations be-
tween the states of Oregon and Wash-
ington.

The Portland Journal recently pub-
lished a table compiled by the secre-
tary of state showing the registration
of the various parties in Oregon up to
May 15 of this year, and giving the
Republican registration at 80,721
against the Democrats' 25,788. The
table was published for the purpose
of disproving the claim that many
Democrats registered as Republicans
in the recent state elections for the
purpose of overthrowing the Republi-
can candidate and electing Chamber-
lain. The figures in this table indicate
something else which might be men-
tioned also, and that other thing is
that it is considerable of a jump be-
tween the Democrat 28,000 and the
Republican 80,000, in spite of the fact
that Oregon's non-partisan (?) daily is
continually having cold chills up and
down its spine as it tells each day
how this, how awfully thin and attenu-
ated, is the margin by which the big
Ohioan may hope to carry this state.
