Oregon game laws and the game warden's fee, are as far as affording a protection to the game birds in this portion of the Willamette valley. Now that the season is opened, hunters in many cases pay no attention to the law and kill far above the limit. At the depot this morning there were ten hunters returning to Portland. Between them they had no less than 250 birds by actual count. One hunter had fifty birds with him which he said he had killed. The season is now only three days old, which would allow of but thirty birds, ten each day, per hunter, by actual count. The violation of the law was apparent with this man or any of the others who were loaded down with birds—Albany Herald.

Conditions in this locality are perhaps not so bad as they are reported to be in those portions of the Willamette Valley where hunters do more frequently congregate, but the game hog like the fish hog, is liable to stray into almost any place. The thing for the real sportsman to do is to supplement the work of the game warden, which is inadequate properly to cope with the question, by their own efforts. The law has fixed a bag limit on pheasant shooting and a man who is a thorough sportsman will observe that law, which was enacted to prevent the destruction of the pheasant and make possible for him the enjoyment of the royal sport in which he delights. While observing the law himself, he has a right to make it his personal business to see that others are not allowed to step in and make his observance of the law come to nothing by a needless, indiscriminate and unrestrained slaughter of the game birds on which their sport depends.

The "straw vote" although approved through all the ages, is never the most substantial basis in the world on which to found a positive prediction concerning the outcome of an election. Whether the votes recently taken on trains, in restaurants, barber shops and so forth, nearly all of which give Mr. Taft a most convincing plurality, prove to a certainty his election in November or not, there is one thing that they do prove. That thing is the fact that Mr. Bryan's plurality if indeed, as many seem fondly to presume, he will have any plurality, is thus far invisible. It is found neither in the bootblack's chair, nor the lobby of the crowded hotel, neither in the coaches of the puffing overland, nor yet in any of the other places where the representative nephews of Uncle Sam are most frequently found. Where is it then?

In addition to balloting for the four presidential electors at the polling places on November 2, the voters of Polk county will also be called upon to settle the question of whether or not we shall establish and maintain a county high school. The question is one of only local importance and significance and parties and affiliations will have nothing to do with its decision. The value of such an institution to the people of Polk county, should it be secured, is readily apparent to every one and it is probable that every public-spirited and progressive voter will cast his ballot in favor of the proposed measure.
