STOCK AND DAIRY.

It does not pay to leave stock in the pasture without shelter on cold, wet nights, and this applies especially to high efficiency cows. One night of chill will make them fall off in milk to an extent that it will take them a full week to recover.

Field Roots For Sheep.
 Any kind of field roots are good, but turnips, rutabagas or mangels are most commonly used. A small quantity fed per day, as small as two or three pounds, will prove very helpful. They have an excellent effect on the digestion. When they are fed in conjunction with the members of the flock. After the cows have produced lambs they may be fed roots with much freedom. They are most excellent for the production of milk—Professor Thomas Shaw.

Buying Cattle.
 An experienced breeder gives this advice to the beginner in buying cattle: A lot of young feeding cattle are changing hands, and a few hints may be appreciated by those who are buying feeders for the first time. Buying locally is a good practice for the beginner. Then he can see the animal before buying and can examine the herd from which it comes. A little care in buying is generally just as important as the feed. As a rule, promising young cattle are retained at home, and the scrubs of the herd are sent to market. One is very likely to get the "three-year-old yearling" in almost any bunch, and often a good many such. We have sent off a few such cattle several months after buying and have found the weights no heavier and occasionally lighter. My advice to the cautious beginner is not to be rash or in a hurry. See the goods yourself. Be on watch for bargains the first time—that is, something good at a price that makes one comparatively safe.

ATTRACTIVE CATTLE.
 Some Facts About the Value of Dutch Belted Animals.
 Not very many pure bred herds of Dutch belted cattle are found anywhere in America, and their appearance of the cattle shows always attracts attention because of the unusual color markings. Each animal possesses the broad white belt about the body presenting the appearance of a blanket. The breed was brought to this country about eighty years ago, and for many years was so rare that herds were exhibited as a circus attraction. All importations were made many years ago, no new herds having been imported during the last half century.
 The Dutch belted cattle have the general qualities of the Holsteins and are inclined to large milk yield. As

Owned by a Connecticut breeder and considered one of the finest specimens of the breed in this country.
 The herds actually exist, they are probably not equal to several other breeds in average milk yield, but the comparison is hardly fair because there are ten herds of Holsteins, Jerseys or Guernseys to one of the belted, and it is easier to select competitive herds of more popular breeds. Five of the Dutch belted cows were exhibited in the Pan American dairy test and ranked eighth or ninth in general dairy qualities.
 One of the best practical uses of the pure bred stock is in crossing with other dairy cattle, says the American Cattle breeder. The grade herd of just

Dutch belted ancestry, is pretty sure to be a good animal for dairy purposes. She will possess the characteristic white belt, although ends of body may be red or roan instead of black. She will be a large milk yielder, the quality being good, although not particularly rich in butter fat. She is also likely to be a long lived producer and perhaps a little more hardy than most pure bred stock. The Dutch belted reproduce their qualities with remarkable exactness when crossed with other stock.

Low Mangers Best.
 Feed the horse from a low manger and not from a high overhead rack. It is not natural for a horse to get his rations in that way. Naturally he eats from the ground. A lot of dust rattles down by the overhead method.

Feeding the Work Horse.
 For a general feed corn and oats in equal parts make a very good ration for a heavy farm horse doing slow work, says Michigan breeder. For the driver oats alone or with a little bran is better. With corn the bran helps to lighten the ration and aids digestion. I should recommend putting a little bran always with any grain ration for this reason. In winter farmers frequently keep their work horses on straw, with a little grain. Where this is done bran should always make part of the ration, for the straw is binding to the bowels, and this tendency the bran counteracts. Some horses are predisposed to colic, and a straw and corn diet is almost sure to cause trouble at frequent intervals with any such cases.

Remedy For Cowpox.
 Oxide of zinc ointment rubbed on the cow's leg morning and night is a very good remedy for cowpox. The disease is carried from cow to cow on the hands of the milker, so when the disease is in the herd milkers should wash their hands carefully after milking each cow. Do not use the milk from affected cows until they are cured.

A Forcing Effect.
 Fresh manure has a forcing effect and tends to produce stems and leaves at the expense of fruit and grain. It is therefore better for early garden truck, grasses and forage plants than for cereals or fruit.
