AN INEXPENSIVE ICEHOUSE.

No Reason Why the Farmer Should Be Without It.
 An icehouse and cool room may be constructed as follows: Excavate a half cellar in a perfectly dry place, from which the surface slopes for may be made to slope in all directions, so as to prevent danger of moisture from want of drainage. A stone or brick wall is built around this and laid in hydraulic cement. The floor is cemented. A frame or other building is built upon this basement to contain the ice. Twelve feet square will be large enough for a moderate sized farm.

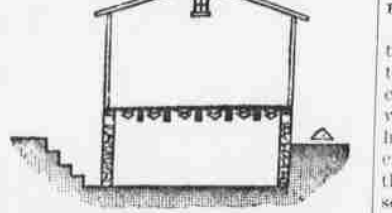


FIG. 1.—ICEHOUSE AND COOL ROOM.

ly, as an icehouse of that size will hold about twenty loads or tons of ice. The main point is the division between the icehouse and the room below it. This must be perfectly airtight and a moderately good conductor of heat. The floor may be laid in the following manner:
 Beams of sufficient strength are laid across and the ends well bedded in cement. A floor of zinc sheets is then laid upon the beams, the sheets being closely nailed to the beams upon strips of rubber sheeting to make the joints water and airtight. The beams should be dressed smoothly. The zinc sheets are bent, as shown in the illustration (Fig. 2). This is for the purpose of causing the moisture, which will condense upon the underside of this ceiling, to flow downward to the lower angle, where it will drip. The drip is caught in the little gutters of zinc shown in the figure, attached to the ceiling and is carried off by a proper drain. With this water will also be carried off much of the impurity of the atmosphere, and if very little ventilation is given there will be little condensation and the air will be kept

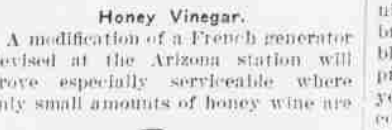
SEED WHEAT.

Grade Generally Used Not Up to the Standard.

That the grade of seed wheat generally used is not up to the standard was ascertained in an investigation by G. W. Shaw of the California station, who secured a large number of samples of seed wheat over a wide area in the Sacramento and San Joaquin valleys of California, to determine the general character of the seed used by the farmers of the state. In general the samples showed that the quality of seed used by most farmers is lacking in purity, perfection of development, weight per bushel, freedom from weeds and freedom from bunt. It is stated that practically all investigators have found the tag of large, plump seed and of a high weight per bushel the most profitable. No permanent benefit is believed to be secured from the frequent exchange of seed unless a better type of wheat or a more vigorous strain of the same type is obtained by the exchange. The use of seed from heavy yielding plants, a plump and heavy grain, a clean wheat and a pure variety are considered by him the most important points in seed selection.
 In this connection the results secured by E. G. Montgomery of the Nebraska station in an experiment with seed wheat and seed oats selected by the use of the fanning mill are of interest. In these experiments heavy seed wheat as separated by the fanning mill did not show an improvement in either yield or quality of grain as compared with light or unseparated

seed, and it is believed that no permanent improvement in quality or yield is to be expected from the use of the fanning mill in seed selection.
 At first thought it would seem that if "like produces like" the large or heavy seeds should produce the best crop. However, we must recognize the individual plant as a unit for selection rather than the individual seed. If a single plant of wheat be taken and the kernels thrashed out it will be found that all sizes of kernels are produced by the plant, some large and some small.
 As every wheat plant contains both heavy and light seed, the fanning mill gives almost the same kind of wheat, so far as inheritance is concerned. In the light wheat as in the heavy. It must be remembered that reference is made here to the permanent results which may be expected from the use of the fanning mill and that its use or the use of screens for removing obnoxious seed is in no way discouraged.

Honey Vinegar.
 A modification of a French generator devised at the Arizona station will prove especially serviceable where only small amounts of honey wine are to be made into vinegar from time to time. A good wine or alcohol barrel is carefully painted on the outside to prevent corrosion of the hoops. THE EUCALYPTUS FOR PROFIT

It Has Been Demonstrated That It Is a Paying Crop.

 Eucalyptus planting has long passed the experimental stage and may be considered without question as a commercial proposition. The value of the crop and the possibilities of growing it in California have been sufficiently

demonstrated to make judicious plantings even on a large scale perfectly safe, with an assurance of sure and reasonably large profits. It is important, however, for the planter to consider in the light of the best information the nature of the product which he will produce, or, in other words, the market which he will attempt to supply with his eucalyptus trees.
 Eucalyptus may be used either for fuel or for hardwood lumber. For the

former purpose the prevailing prices of wood in most of our cities and large towns during the past few years have been such as to make the fuel proposition appear extremely attractive. Many glowing prospectuses are being offered to the public on this basis. It should be remembered, however, that the production and use of natural oil are rapidly increasing, that gas and electricity for heating purposes are cheap in the cities and that all three are coming more and more into use every day in the place of wood. In fact, wood as fuel is rapidly becoming a luxury, and there is in the mind of the writer no reason for expecting any increase in its use as fuel by the general public. He therefore believes it unprofitable and unwise to enter upon eucalyptus planting with the sole idea of raising wood for fuel. The profits to be derived from eucalyptus in the future will be found in hardwood lumber for wagon work, farm and other implements, railroad, coach and house finishing, furniture, etc. Ties, telephone poles and bridge timber will also prove profitable. For any of the above named products of eucalyptus at least ten years' growth will be required, and of course the older the trees the greater the profits in proportion.

The wood of most of the eucalyptus makes good fuel. A grove of blue gum five years old, set out 6 by 6 feet apart, under favorable conditions

 Lumber required: Nine pieces 1 by 12, sixteen feet long, and eleven but-tons sixteen feet long for roof; five pieces 1 by 12, fourteen feet long, for ends; one piece 2 by 4, ten feet long, for ridge; two pieces 2 by 8, ten feet long, for plates; seven pieces 2 by 4, sixteen feet long, for rafters and braces in frame; three pieces 2 by 6, eight feet long, for stringers, and four pieces 1 by 12, sixteen feet long, for flooring.

SILAGE FOR MILK COWS.

Most Profitable Way to Feed This Valuable Ration.

 Perhaps there is no benefit derived from silage by feeding it to milk cows than by feeding it to any other kind of stock. At any rate, it is used more and thought more of by dairymen than by any other class of farmers.

Cows should never be fed exclusively on silage. They need some dry forage to go with it; they need a certain amount of roughage and some more nitrogenous food to go with it to make a well balanced ration. About thirty or at most forty pounds of a dry cow should be fed to each cow. It should be fed from the top of the silo, taking off about two inches in depth from the entire surface each day. For if it is long exposed to the air it will be damaged. If the feeding commences immediately after filling the silo—and this is a good way to do it—there will be no damaged silage at all. Care should be taken at each time of feeding to leave the surface smooth and even and not pick and stir it up with the fork, for that will let in the air and cause damage.
 In any silage feed the silage ration in two feeds, both night and morning, and it is better to feed after milking because the peculiar odor of the silage might affect the flavor of the milk.
 Cows as well as other stock have a wonderful liking for silage, and I believe much of the success in feeding it can be attributed to its palatability. They even prefer it to a certain extent at least, to fresh cut forage or good hay. In the winter I have seen cows in June when on good pasture which had been fed silage every day come to the gate at 4 o'clock in the afternoon and bellow and ask to come to the barn and get silage, which they would eat greedily and apparently with great relish. I have seen the experiment tried of offering the cows at the same time corn cut fresh from the field and silage that was put up the year before. Every cow chose the silage and ate that first. It is true these cows had been fed silage every day all summer, and it may be the habit of eating silage had something to do with their preferring it, but they surely would not have done it if silage had not been pretty good feed.
 Silage is a better and cheaper feed to supplement short pastures, which we are almost sure to have every summer on account of drought or other causes, than good silage. I know some of the most successful dairymen in the country who feed silage every day in the year, winter as well as summer.

 If the house is to be used in extremely cold weather an easily manipulated door is necessary. The cut shows a door two feet wide and two feet six inches high, made to slide up and down and held in place by cleats. The cut also shows two iron eyes, bolted into the front joist of the building, to which the hitch is made when the building is moved.
 A rear door, identical in size with the front door, is held in place by cleats nailed across it on the inside and by buttons fastened on the outside. This door is not opened regularly, but provides ventilation in summer and aids in handling sows at farrowing time. Above the rear door is a small sliding door 8 by 12 inches in size.

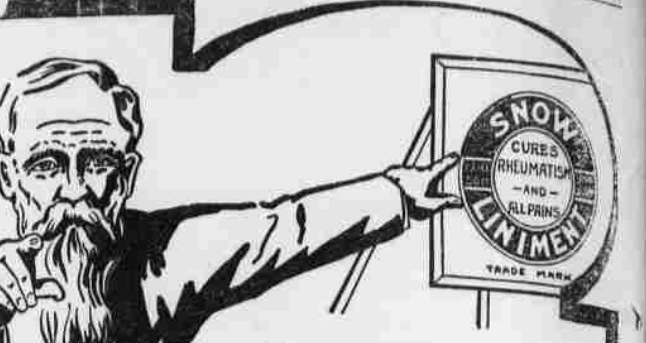
