HORTICULTURAL COURSE

Farmers May Study Up-To-Date Methods By Special Lectures at Agricultural College.

A six weeks' course in horticulture is now under way at the Agricultural College, Corvallis, Oregon, and the attendance from different parts of the state being more than double that of last year.

Beginning February 8, a special course of two weeks will be given in walnut grafting. The most important methods of walnut grafting will be taken up, including the very successful and famous Payne method.

During the last two weeks of the course two hours a day of practical instruction will be given in spraying, pruning, staking and setting of orchards. This work includes apples, grapes, peaches, cherries, etc.
