Dich lot of 31 bales, at Silverton, bought by William Brown & Co, at 7½ cents, and the Louis Pose lot of 36 bales at Sher-wood, purchased by J. J. Metzler at t 7½ cents. Some of these lots are only medium, and when it is considered that but a short time ago they were valued at a nickel, the tendency of the market can be readily seen. The demand for contracts is even greater than that for spot goods. Ten cents is the ruling price for the 1909 crop, and at this figure it is estimated that fully 5000 bales have been signed up in the past ten days. Oregonian.
