In the Carmack murder trial the overworked unwritten law has been extended by Cooper's attorney to protect men who murder to avenge insults against their "honah." This may seem to the cooler headed of our citizens a trifle of a stretch, but then the unwritten law, like the dementia plea, has always been elastic.

Preparations are being made for bringing an enormous pressure to bear at the coming special session of the legislature, to bring about an appropriation for the three state normal schools. Such action, while no doubt prompted by motives entirely right, is ill advised. The coming session of the legislature was called for the purpose solely of correcting old errors and any effort to bring up new questions of legislation or in fact any legislation foreign to the purpose for which the session has been called, will be promptly (and rightly) suppressed. Again, the normal schools like the poor, we have had "always with us" (how unfortunately exact the analogy) and they have never been rated, by the people as a whole, at anything like their real value. To allow them for a time to drop out of the niche in our educational temple, which they have filled so long, unostentatiously and pitifully unappreciated, may have a really beneficial effect in awakening the people to their real importance in the state. The cure is a trifle harsh perhaps, but if it will bring about a complete regeneration, it will prove ultimately to have been superior to the policy of eking out a scant and begrudged existence—nothing more—as the schools have been obliged to do in the past.

NEW LEAFLETS RECEIVED

Development League Has More Literature For Use In Campaign To Boost Dallas.

The colonist rate leaflets printed by the Sunset Company for the use of the Dallas Development League in its advertising and boosting campaign have been received by Hon. U. S. Loughary, president of the League, and a number of them distributed among the business men and citizens of Dallas.

The leaflet has on its title page "Colonist Rates to Dallas, Oregon, daily during March and April, 1909." The two following pages contain a list of the rates to Dallas, from all of the principal points in the United States and Canada. Then comes a three page descriptive sketch concerning Dallas and vicinity and the various industries and resources of this section. The remainder of the booklet is devoted to general information as to time of trains leaving, sources from which further information may be secured, etc., the last two pages containing a map giving the exact location of Dallas and the most direct routes by rail thither.

The leaflet is of a convenient size to fit an ordinary envelope and the plan is to have copies of it distributed among the people of Dallas so that every letter mailed from this city to the East in future, may contain one. The descriptive "write up" is very good, much better in fact than in the first pamphlet issued, and should have a marked effect in attracting the attention of prospective immigrants from the East to Dallas.

The first pamphlet "How To Get To Dallas, Oregon," although in some respects not entirely satisfactory, resulted in a flood of inquiries from Eastern cities where it was sent, that fairly overwhelmed H. G. Campbell, the secretary of the Development League.

Another proof of their influence is given by the advance man of the Oregon, W. E. Critchlow. He says that in the cities where he attended games, the pamphlets distributed were eagerly snapped up by the spectators and after the supply had been exhausted the members of the Oregon's party would be eagerly pressed by a throng of interested persons, asking for more literature and further information.

"Colonist rate" leaflets may be secured from Mr. Loughary or Mr. Campbell on request and the Development League urges that every citizen secure some and see to it that no letter addressed to any point east of the Rocky Mountains leaves Dallas, without having one of the little "booster leaflets" enclosed.
