No internal injury resulted but it will be some time before he is again able to be at work.—Sheridan Sun.

Change of Venue To Polk.
Clerk Moses has been busy the past few days transcribing papers in the case of M. Bailey vs. Benton county, which has been venued to Polk county. Mr. Bailey is suing Benton county for \$1750 damages alleged to be due him for injuries received May 4, 1907. A bridge near Albany, over which he was riding on a load of wood, collapsed. Mr. Bailey was cut and bruised his animals and wagon were injured, and he now sues for the sum named. The County court offered to settle this

case by paying Mr. Bailey \$225 but the amount was spurned. The case will come up in Polk county at the May term of court, Attorneys McFadden & Bryson representing Benton county, and Weatherford & Wyatt backing Mr. Bailey.—Corvallis Times.
