The way to build up Dallas is to pat-
ronize Dallas people.

Let us suppose, for the sake of argu-
ment, that there are 1500 Republi-
can voters in Polk County. Let us sup-
pose further that six Republican can-
didates are in the field for the same
office. With the primary vote divided
anything like equally among the six,
it would be possible under the existing
law for a candidate to win the nomi-
nation with less than 200 votes. The
successful candidate might be a man
whom the remaining 1200 voters
would not be willing to support for
office under any condition. Would
such a nomination represent the "will
of the people?" The Observer thinks
not, and until convinced of the error
of its reasoning, this paper will con-
tinue to oppose the present happy-go-
lucky, every-man-for-himself system
of nominating public officers. Under
the convention system, whatever its
faults, no man could be nominated
without a majority vote of the dele-
gates. Nor will it be possible this
year for any aspirant to receive as-
sembly endorsement unless a majority
of the delegates representing his po-
litical party shall be favorable to his
 candidacy. The opponents of the as-
sembly plan would have you believe
that the nomination of the candidate
receiving only 300 votes out of 1500,
provided the 300 votes constituted a
plurality, would represent the "peo-
ple's will." But it is a noticeable fact
that these same champions of the
people are usually the first to go to
the polls and vote for the opposing
party's candidate when some particu-
lar "people's candidate" happens to
be distasteful to them. Hence the sur-
prisingly great number of Democratic
officeholders in Republican Oregon.

The Newberg Graphic, always a live
local newspaper, has discarded its
patent inside and is giving its readers
eight pages of home print. Liberal ad-
vertising patronage from the Newberg
business men has made the change
necessary. The Graphic is one of the
nearest papers that comes to our desk.

Government engineers will recom-
mend that no more money be spent in
improving the Yamhill River above
Dayton. They say that it is only a
matter of time until the Oregon Elec-
tric will be running its cars into Mc-
Minnville and that it will not be pos-
sible for steamboats on a small, shall-
ow river like the Yamhill to success-
fully compete with the trolley cars in
hauling freight and passengers. For
the same reason, it is not probable
that any new steamboat lines will be
established on the upper Willamette.
Strange as it may seem, when a rail-
road or an electric line is built along
a river bank, the steamboats are soon
put out of business.

The Observer has received from the
"Northwest County" boosters a printed
argument in favor of the creation of
the county, also a map showing the
proposed boundaries. The zig-zag ap-
pearance of the boundary lines re-
minds one more of a scrip in a crazy
quiltwork than of a subdivision
of a state. If Northwest County shall be
created according to the lines laid
down in this map, it will enjoy the
distinction of being the crookedest
county in the United States. As to the
advantages of creating another coun-
ty out of the territory now embraced
by Linn and Lane counties, the
Linn and Lane boosters are pre-
pared to express an opinion at this
time. But certain it is that the map
showing the proposed boundary lines
tends color to the accusation of the
Eugene and Roseburg newspapers to
the effect that the lines have been
carefully laid out so as to take in the
cream of the rich land and leave all
of the expensive roads and bridges to
be maintained by the taxpayers of the
old counties. If this is not true, the
Northwest boosters owe it to their cause
to explain to the voters why the pro-
posed boundary lines were laid out in
such a zig-zag manner.

SPRING CLEANING.
It is apparent from the publicity
being given the spring cleaning of
towns and cities that the spring clean-
ing movement is widespread. A special
letter to the Hood River News on this
subject says:
"Every city and town in the North-
west should join in the spring clean-
up movement, for it is undoubtedly
true that every section of Oregon,
Washington and Idaho will be visited
by a large number of Easterners. The
West earned a reputation last summer
as a fine summer resort and accord-
ing to the best information obtainable
there will be many tourists coming
to the Northwest during the warm
months. The city has gone out to clean
up; plant more trees and shrubbery,
abolish the disagreeable billboards;
preserve your beautiful landscape; let
the visitor be able to see the real beau-
ty of your city. In many cities and
towns the cry is being heard; the bill-
board man is being told that he is not
wanted; if the man who uses the bill-
boards for advertising want real re-
sults, let him advertise in the home
paper; that is the medium which
gives results, and the medium which
should be used."

amendment to, the Charter of the City
of Dallas, Oregon, which will be sub-
mitted to the legal voters of said City
for their approval or rejection at the
General City Election to be held in
said City on Monday, the 4th day of
April, 1910.

POR an amendment to the Charter of
the City of Dallas, Oregon, making
and constituting an entire and sepa-
rate road district out of the territory
embraced within the corporate
limits of Dallas, Oregon, and
placing the entire control over all
public highways, streets, alleys, and
bridges within the corporate limits
of Dallas, Oregon, in said City of
Dallas; and giving to the Street
Commissioner of said City the powers
and duties of Road Supervisors
under the General Law, within the
said City.

Be It Resolved by the City Council of
the City of Dallas:

Section 1. The following amend-
ment to the Charter of the City of
Dallas, Oregon, is hereby proposed, to
wit:

Immediately after Section 61 of an
Act of the Legislative Assembly of the
State of Oregon, entitled, "AN ACT to
incorporate the City of Dallas, in Polk
County, Oregon, and to provide a
Charter thereof, and to repeal all Acts
or parts of Acts heretofore passed to
incorporate the Town of Dallas, or
City of Dallas, in said County and
State, and all Amendments thereto,
whether in conflict with this Act or
otherwise," approved by the Govern-
or of the State of Oregon, on the 4th
day of February, 1901; the said Char-
ter, and the same is hereby amended
by the addition thereof of Section 61a,
which Section shall read as follows, to
wit:

Section 61a. The territory within the
corporate limits of the City of
Dallas, Polk County, Oregon, is hereby
made and constituted a separate and
entire Road District of Polk County,
State of Oregon, and control over all
public highways, streets, alleys, and
bridges within the corporate limits of
the City of Dallas, is hereby placed
in and given to the said City of Dallas.

1. All the inhabitants and property
within the corporate limits of the said
City shall be liable to the payment of
road taxes under the laws of the State
of Oregon, and all taxes for road pur-
poses paid by persons residing within
and upon property situated within the
corporate limits of said City shall,
when collected, be paid to the said
City, and shall be applied to the im-
provement, repair, and maintenance of
the streets, alleys, public highways,
and bridges within said City.

2. All the inhabitants within the
corporate limits of the said City, not
except under the General Law of the
State of Oregon, shall be liable to the
payment of Road Poll taxes under the
laws of the State of Oregon, and all
Road Poll taxes paid by persons residing
within the corporate limits of the said
City shall, when paid, be applied to the
improvement, repair, and maintenance
of the streets, alleys, public highways,
and bridges within said City.

3. The power and authority given by
the General Laws of the State of
Oregon to the County Court of Polk
County, to appoint Road Supervisors,
and to lay out or work highways, shall
not apply to or extend to the territory
within the limits of the said City of
Dallas, Polk County, Oregon; but the
said City of Dallas and the territory
embraced within the corporate limits
of the said City shall be under the
jurisdiction of said Court upon said sub-
jects; PROVIDED, however, that the
Street Commissioner of said City of
Dallas having control of the repair
and maintenance of streets within the
said City shall be the Road Super-
visor of the said district created hereby,
and he shall care for and improve the
public streets, alleys, highways, and
bridges within said City, under the di-
rection of, and make his report to the
Council of said City; and the said
Street Commissioner shall collect the
road poll taxes due from the inhabi-
tants of the City of Dallas, in the man-
ner prescribed by the General Law of
the State of Oregon for Road Super-
visors; and he shall have the same
power and authority to collect and en-
force the payment of such road poll
taxes as is provided in such General
Law for Road Supervisors; but all
suits, actions, or proceedings concern-
ing road poll taxes shall be prosecuted in
the name of the City of Dallas. The
said Street Commissioner shall report
the application of said money collected
to the City Council of said City.

4. All levies made by the City
Council of said City of Dallas for road
and taxes, shall be known and designat-
ed as a special tax for a special purpose;
and such a levy is not to be deemed a
part of the ten mill levy permitted to
be made by the said City for General
municipal purposes; but if made, it is to
be in addition thereto, and separate
therefrom.

5. All levies made for roads and
highways within the corporate limits
of said City are to be made at the
time and place, and in the manner
provided for the levying of other taxes
by the said City.
