MUCH WORK FOR VOTERS

MUST PASS ON TEN BILLS AND NINE AMENDMENTS.

Only One Law Submitted by Referendum Petition; Ballot Will Resemble Horse Blanket.

It is now definitely known that at least nineteen measures will be submitted to the voters of Oregon at the coming election, under the initiative and referendum. A brief outline of these measures is as follows:

Four constitutional amendments are proposed by the legislature as follows:

Constitutional Amendments. 1. For an amendment of section 1, of article 9, of the constitution of the State of Oregon, directing a uniform rule of taxation "except on property specifically taxed," authorizing the levy and collection of taxes for state purposes and for county and other municipal purposes upon different classes of property, and appropriating state taxes among the several counties as county obligations.

2. For an amendment of section 32, article 1, of the constitution of Oregon, by omitting the words "and all taxation shall be equal and uniform," and inserting in lieu thereof the words: "taxes shall be levied and collected for public purposes only, and the power of taxation shall never be surrendered, suspended or contracted away."

3. For the amendment of article 9 of the Oregon constitution, authorizing the municipal, railroad districts, and the purchase and construction of railroads or other highways, by the state, counties, municipalities and railroad districts, creation of liens upon property or levying taxes for the payment of same, and nullifying the exemption from taxation of property used for municipal, educational, literary, scientific, or charitable purposes. (Note: Another amendment of section 1, of said article 9, is pending and is not in harmony herewith.)

4. For amendment of sections 6 and 7, article 4, of the constitution of this state, to provide a separate district for the election of each state senator and each state representative.

Submitted by Legislature.

Measures submitted by the legislature:

(1) An act authorizing the purchase of a site for and the construction and maintenance of a branch asylum, to be located, in the discretion of the board of trustees of the Oregon state insane asylum, at or within five miles of either of the following cities, to-wit: Baker City, Pendleton or Union, in Eastern Oregon, to be called "The Eastern Oregon State Hospital."

(2) An act to elect on the first Monday in June, 1911, delegates to a constitutional convention to be held on the second Monday in October, 1911, for revising the constitution of the state, and providing for submission of the proposed constitution, so revised to the legal voters of the state for adoption or rejection on the first Monday in April, 1912.

Referendum on One Measure.

One legislative act is submitted by referendum petition. It is:

1. An act providing for the payment of \$1,000 annually to the judge of the eighth judicial district, by Baker county, in addition to the annual salary of \$2,000 received by him from the state.

Submitted by Initiative.

Measures submitted by initiative petition as follows:

1. A bill for an act to create the county of Sessmith out of a portion of the northern part of Douglas county and the southern part of Lane county; providing for its organization, fixing the salaries of the officers thereof, and for the adjusting of finances between the three counties.

2. Woman's taxpaying suffrage amendment, granting to all taxpayers, regardless of sex, the right of suffrage.

Ten to Be Elected.

Five initiative measures are not yet filed, but are being prepared. They are:

1. Ashland normal school bill. 2. Weston normal school bill. 3. Mouth normal school bill. 4. U'Ren's bill for people's inspectors of government.

5. Employees' liability bill.

The People's Progressive Government League has proposed five measures as follows:

1. State-wide prohibition. 2. U'Ren's amendment to article IV of the constitution. 3. Same for article V. 4. Same for article VI. 5. Same for article VII.

The total is nine proposed constitutional amendments and ten bills.

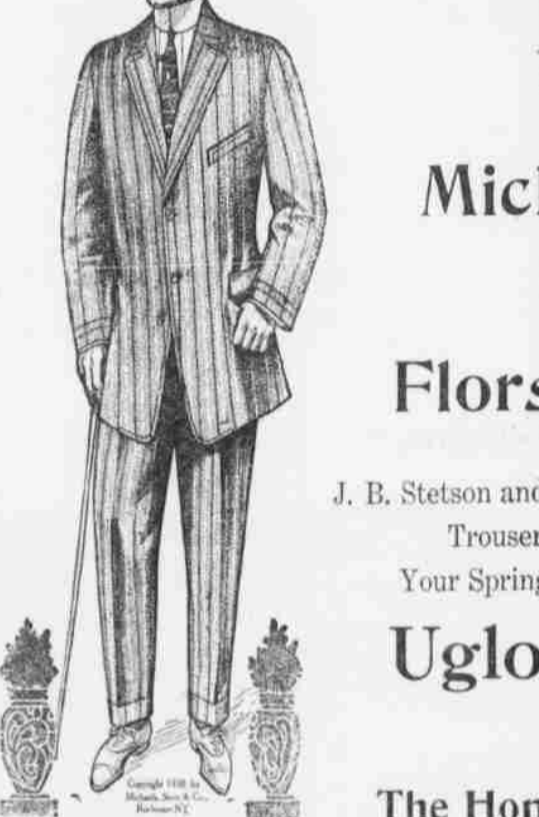
