WILL ASK FOR BONDS.

In response to a petition signed by many voters, the Directors of the Dallas school district have called a special election to be held Monday, April 25, at which time a vote will be taken on the question of contracting a bonded indebtedness of \$40,000 for the purpose of purchasing ground and erecting a High School building for the district.

The people of Dallas are to be congratulated that this long-neglected movement is at last definitely under way, and it is hoped that nothing will occur to prevent the improvement from being carried to a successful completion before the beginning of another school year. The need of a High School in Dallas is appreciated and admitted by all, and nothing remains but to decide upon necessary plans and details for carrying out the improvement.

In disposing of these details, such as location, cost and style of building, etc., the Observer believes that the directors should take the people into their fullest confidence and submit as nearly as possible a definite proposal to be voted on. No plans that the school officials might submit would prove satisfactory to all, but in a general way the taxpayers have a right to know how their money is to be used. While \$40,000 is a large sum of money to be expended for a building, it may be that a structure creditable to the district cannot be built for a less amount, and for this reason the directors should be able to submit a general idea of the kind of building to be erected. Of course, every citizen of the district realizes that it would not be good business policy to indicate a preference for any particular style of architecture and finish prior to the letting of the contract, but, on the other hand, the directors should be able at the coming school meeting to submit to the people a general proposal as to the size of building, number of rooms, whether to be constructed of brick or stone, or both, and an estimate of the amount that should be used in the purchase of a building lot.

The Observer believes that an estimate of this kind from the school officers will remove any doubt of the result of the coming bond election and greatly facilitate the work of getting the building under way at the earliest possible date. Only twice within the district has the patrons of the school means of knowing what they were voting for, or against, and being without such knowledge, they took the safe course and voted "against." In each instance, in a second election, with a general proposal from the school board as to what was to be done with the money, bonds were voted for the needed improvement with scarcely a dissenting voice.

The High School should be built as soon as men and money can build it. Already, the improvement has been delayed too long. The building should be modern; it should be sanitary; it should be a credit to the live and growing city of Dallas. If it is necessary to spend \$40,000 in its construction, bonds to the amount of \$40,000 should be promptly voted. If the work can be done for less money, a smaller amount should be voted. Before being asked to vote on the question, the people should ascertain as nearly as possible the best location for the school, the amount of school ground necessary and the cost thereof, and the style and kind of building itself. When these details are settled to the satisfaction of a majority of the patrons of the district, the amount of money then found necessary should be voted cheerfully and without delay. Dallas' greatest need today is a good High School.

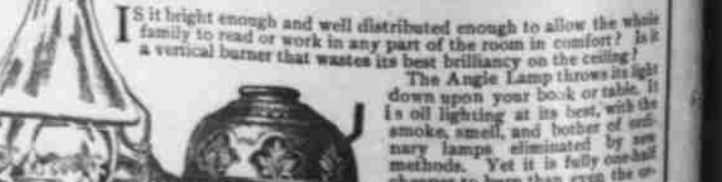
