

VOTES FOR CITY WATER

IMPROVEMENT CARRIES AT FALLS CITY BY HEAVY VOTE.

Bonds to Amount of \$20,000 Will Be Sold and Plant Rushed to Completion.

FALLS CITY, Or., April 4.—The annual election held here today resulted in an overwhelming victory for progress and development. The waterworks proposal was carried by a vote of 154 to 10, and the movement to make the city a separate road district and to use the tax in the improvement of the streets was endorsed by a vote of 126 to 11.

The councilmen elected today and the number of votes received by each are as follows: W. T. Grier, 131; C. O. Johnson, 99; J. O. Chamberlain, 98. Running close up to the winners, but failing of election, were L. W. Zorn, who received 80 votes, and Dr. W. H. Becker, who received 78.

Under the authority granted them by the people today, the city officers will now proceed to sell bonds of the city to the amount of \$20,000, and with the proceeds derived therefrom will install a modern system of gravity waterworks. It is probable that bids for the bonds will be asked at once, as the council is desirous of beginning work on the plant at the earliest possible date, in order that the system may be completed before Fall.

OREGON IS GROWING

Development and Progress Are Noted on Every Hand.

PORTLAND, Or., April 5 (Special).—The sale of the big land grant of the Willamette Valley and Cascade Mountains Road company during the past week to capitalists said to represent the Hill interests indicates to many that the reported Pacific Coast outlet for the Burlington will become a reality. It is believed Hill will build west from Billings, the present terminus, to Boise and thence westward through Ontario and across Oregon to Coos Bay. The purchase price of this big land grant will run up into the millions. If its purchase by Hill can be confirmed, and this railway is built, it will mean a great development for Oregon, for it will open up the most isolated sections to settlement.

It is expected to complete the jetty at the mouth of the Columbia River this season. Work starts today on extending it further, and the dredge Chinook will operate on the bar during the summer. By the time the work stops in November, it is expected to have a depth of 30 feet on the bar at low tide.

One of the big wheat farms of the state was sold the past week when the lands of the J. A. Woolery estate, in Morrow County, passed to a syndicate of North Dakota bankers. The sale included 19,999 acres and the price paid was \$150,000. It will be cut up into small farms.

The purchase of a big tract of timber land on the Siuslaw River during the past week by Porter Bros., believed to represent J. J. Hill, strengthens the belief that the east and west line across Oregon will be built.

The biggest shipment of spraying material ever sent to any fruit district in Oregon was received during the past week at Medford, when 90,000 pounds arrived. It will be used to fight fruit pests in the Rogue River Valley.

An Open River and Freight Rate convention will be held at Albany on April 14. It will be largely attended. Work will soon be begun on the new Federal building at Pendleton, which will cost \$50,000.

Only four votes were recorded against the proposed \$40,000 bond issue to erect a high school at Lakeview.

About a quarter million will be spent by the Coos Bay Gas & Electric company in new equipment and extensions.

A canal will be begun soon to drain and reclaim 19,000 acres in the Wood River Valley, Klamath County.

The O. R. & N. farming demonstration train that was run through Eastern Oregon & Washington, returning the past week, was the most successful ever operated in this state.
