

CANDIDATES SCARCE

Oregon Congressmen May Get Another Term by Default.

(Salem Journal.) Political gossip as to the two Oregon congressmen is not highly complimentary. It is conceded that Ellis may get another term because three candidates will try for the nomination against him—Kennedy, of Baker City, an insurgent, and Logan and Shepard, of Portland. So long as Portland is in his district, Ellis is perfectly safe, as there will always be a multiplicity of candidates. But in the Eastern Oregon district alone, with Portland out of it, some bright campaigner would take the district to-day.

Congressman Hawley is considered ripe for the slaughter, but no one seems to be making distinct headway against him. He has practically put all postoffice appointments on the shelf until after the November election. A strong insurgent candidate would sweep this district, as the people do not consider that they have a tariff revision such as was promised them.

The Circuit Judges. For circuit judges the names used among the political gossips are those of George H. Burnett, to succeed himself; Percy Kelly and Charles H. McNary to succeed Hon. Wm. Galloway. The Marion county legislative ticket involves no politics this year to amount to anything, and the fight will be to get good level-headed business men to take the places.
