THE CELERY BED.

There is no other for the table which is more delicious than crisp, juicy flavored celery from the home garden, the growing of which is no more a difficult matter, if one has not thought of the matter in time to raise plants from the seed, which require two or three weeks to germinate, they may be secured from a neighbor or market gardener. For early use there is no variety which is superior to the Golden Self Blanching, but any variety that one can get will do well with proper care. The important point is to set out stalky, vigorous plants, taking care to prune back both top and roots at the time of transplanting. A simple plan for the bed is to remove about eight inches of earth from a spot in the garden which will be convenient for watering, say 4 by 20 feet, or from a still larger tract if more celery is wanted. Into the soil at the bottom of this trench should be worked 1/2 lb. or four wheelbarrow loads of manure, well rotted fertilizer. The plants should be set six to eight inches apart in the rows and the rows ten inches apart, enough to permit of frequent hoeing. Being set below the surface of the ground, the bed will not dry out rapidly, while the work of watering is thereby greatly simplified. If there is no one about the house to dig the trench the plants may be set on the level ground and given the same cultivation and somewhat more frequent watering than in the low bed. When the plants have reached a foot or fifteen inches the hilling process may be begun and five or six inches of the soil originally removed from the trench replaced, care being exercised to hold the stalks of the plants close together so as to prevent dirt settling into the crown. Three or four weeks later, depending somewhat upon the rapidity of growth, four or five inches more of earth should be filled in about the plants, and under usual conditions this will give all the blanching necessary. In a relatively short time after this second hilling the celery will be bleached sufficiently for the table. If any is left at the beginning of winter the plants may be taken up with plenty of roots and the earth adhering and put in a box in the cellar, where they will continue bleaching and be crisp and tender until after the holidays.

THE PRECOOLING OF FRUIT.

Great benefit is expected to come to the fruit growers of the Pacific coast from the plants which have been installed at several points in California and will shortly be erected at other points for the precooling of fruit destined for transcontinental shipment.

In the past, even the most careful refrigeration en route, both in portable coolers and growers have sustained serious loss as a result of fruit spoiling in transit. In these new precooling plants, which are really mammoth refrigerating plants, whole train loads of fruit can be reduced to a temperature close to the freezing point in the course of two or three hours, artificial means being used to draw the warm air from and inject the cold air into the cars. Car loads of fruit made ready for shipment in this way are given the usual blanching treatment, with the result that the fruit arrives at its destination in as nearly perfect condition as possible, the loss resulting from the fruit being in heated condition at the time of shipment, as has been the case heretofore, being virtually nothing. The installation of these plants at several points in the Pacific coast not only in the west, but in other parts of the country, will mean increased revenue for the growers of fruit and a greatly improved quality for the consumer.

THE BIG FREEZE.

Harvest time will be the extent of the damage wrought by the fourteen cold spell which visited those four or five of the lake, Ohio and Mississippi valley states during the last ten days in April. It caught fruit trees of all kinds in full blossom or tender young fruit and also killed the new leaves and tender twigs of shrubs and forest trees and killed or greatly weakened the vitality of thousands of acres of newly sown grain and corn. Farther south in the tobacco and cotton belts, the damage was less, the extent of which can only be determined later. To the west on the great plains immense damage was done to grain and fruit, while fruit growers in Utah and Colorado report their losses at from 50 per cent up. Those who are acquainted with the meteorological annals of the sections under the sway of the Medicine Hat weather hierarchy feared just such a contingency when the wires got crossed and April and May weather was dispensed all through March. However, it is too early in the season to say that the damage will be exceeding kind the rest of the year.

An Iowa farmer got rid of a good sized patch of Canada thistles last year, after several methods had failed, by plowing them every ten days from April until August, and then sowing the tract heavily with timothy. Two weeks later he was unable to find a single thistle.

It is a whole lot more sensible to jog along behind old Kate or Dobbin with a seat egg in the bank than to be scooting over the highways in a late model automobile, the purchase of which has meant the putting of a mortgage on the town home or farmstead. Many the folks who have done or are doing this very thing in haste who will doubtless have opportunity to repent at leisure.

Perhaps there is no influence which tends to get the boys and girls started in the right path in taking up the work of outdoors and the home so much as a little appreciation bestowed now and then, even if the point should be strained a bit at times, for, after all, excellence of achievement in any case is a comparative and not an absolute matter. Appreciation will make a task a pleasure instead of drudge work, which it so often degenerates into when only criticism is given.

The first navel orange tree of which there is any record was found growing on the north shore of the Mediterranean sea in the year 1593 by a monk, who wrote a description of the tree and fruit and painted a picture of it. Grafts of this tree were later taken to Spain and thence to South America, whence scions were brought to this country by an American trader in 1820, they being propagated in the botanical gardens at Washington. Because of this fact it is usually called the Washington navel.

Growers of sweet peas in a good many sections in this favorite source of fragrant bloom are disappointed last season by the green aphides, or plant lice. These are sucking and not biting insects, and hence the ordinary poisons do not reach them. They must be killed by contact with some spray, and for this purpose it is better than any solution made by steeping tobacco leaves or stems in warm water. This may be applied to the vines with an effective hand sprayer. If one treatment does not kill all of the lice, a second application should be given.

Inspections made at the different points of the coast show that fully 2 per cent of all hogs killed are affected with tuberculosis. An interesting fact in connection with this state of affairs is that the outward and seemingly thrifty appearance of an animal is no guarantee whatever that it is free from the disease. Investigations into the causes of the disease in hogs show the most frequent causes of infection to be the feeding on butterfat from creameries, eating milk from tuberculous cows and feeding behind cattle affected with tuberculosis.

As a result of a recent order issued by the secretary of the Interior there have been withdrawn from entry in Wyoming, Utah and Idaho 2,000,000 acres of land which are underlaid with phosphate. He has also recommended to congress that a law be passed which will permit of the mining of this rock phosphate, but only on the condition that none of it be exported. Secretary Ballinger is to be commended for this action, inasmuch as half of the phosphate mined in this country last year was exported, here would seem to be a phase of the conservation of resources movement that congressmen might well give their aid to.

Breeders of Jersey cattle seem to be dividing into two camps over the question of the type of cow which shall be accepted as a standard by growers of this breed of dairy cattle. Some, the minority, contend that the showing type—the smaller island type—should be adopted as the standard. More hold that the larger American type of cow with the big barrel and udder, the one which makes the best showing in pail and churn, shall be the model to copy after. Since dairymen keep cows for the money rather than the pleasure there is in the business the latter type of cow would seem to be the one which will ultimately prevail.

Dried Beet Pulp as Feed.

Dried beet pulp is considered to be a great dairy feed. It's only a short time since it was considered a waste product.

Give Cow a Vacation.

A cow should have at least six weeks' vacation between milking periods. If she is milked continually she will not last long.

Cleaning the Udder Well.

The cow's udder should be well washed and dried with coarse cloth before milking, and the milk's hands should be washed after every cow.

Making Butter.

Butter to be graded as extra must have a quick and fresh flavor. Its body must be good and uniform. The color must be good for the season when properly salted, neither gritty nor flat.

Skim Milk and Cream.

Some one that cow separators and have good herds of cows report much profit in selling cream to one class of customers and skim milk to another set. Sometimes the same customers want both the cream and skim milk. An account of the separation they pay more for each.

Spinach and Beets contain large quantities of iron, and this fact alone would seem to justify a generous consumption of them in the shape of greens by those whose blood needs toning up. Incidentally, too, when cooked with a teaspoonful of salt pork they make a mighty toothsome ration for a fellow whose blood doesn't need any tonic.

The burdock, one of the most common and useful of weeds known to every property owner, is a biennial that is, lives two years. The young plants may be killed easily with the hoe, while those that are in their second year may be put out of business by running the root through with a spade a couple of inches below the crown.

There is no recipe for cooking soft boiled eggs that gives more uniform or more satisfactory results than putting the eggs in boiling water—an egg to a pint—and allowing them to cook in a slow stream to remain from eight to ten minutes, depending a bit upon how one wants them cooked. Eggs prepared in this way are evenly cooked and are never overdone, even if forgotten and left in the water overtime.

SHINING EYES AROUND.

First Year Very Troublesome in Life of Animals.

Having been an extensive grower of wool and lambs for twenty years, says a well known shepherd, I will give some experience and observations I have had in developing the ewe lambs, by which I trust some one will be benefited.

Every year while buying a few or five lambs for feeding purposes I have an opportunity to observe what a great many flock owners are doing with their ewe lambs, and I am sorry to say that this part of the flock is sorely neglected in altogether too many instances.

The first year is the critical period in the life of the ewe lamb, and if they are improperly fed and cared for but little improvement can be expected in the flock. The impression is carried by many farmers that it is not important to force the ewe lambs along the first year, as they have two seasons to come to maturity. I consider this a very wrong impression of the situation and one that has an important bearing upon the improvement of the flock.

Experience has taught me that much cheaper gains can be made and much more rapidly in the first year of the lamb's growth than during any period thereafter. Ewe lambs that are allowed to stop growing the first year never regain normal condition and, despite good breeding, they fail to transmit to their offspring the desirable qualities found in their parents.

I have observed ewe lambs in my own flocks that, because of insufficient nourishment during the suckling period, failed to make the growth they should have made. Because of the good breeding behind these lambs I retained some of them to replenish my flock. I have found that, with one or two exceptions out of a large number of instances, I have never secured a satisfactory result from natural selection for breeding purposes.


I am very confident that the first year of life determines to a large extent the future usefulness of the ewe lamb. A ewe that has been full grown will bring and hold her milk and hardiness and bring forth well developed offspring. If she has been poorly cared for during her early life the reverse is invariably the result.

A female of any kind must have a strong, healthy system, with vigorous constitution to withstand the natural functions of reproduction. Those characteristics come into natural development early and do not change as the animal ages.

Therefore if one wants his ewe lambs to grow into strong, healthy and vigorous breeding stock he must begin feeding them as soon as he can get them, and if he has been poorly furnished by the dam. This feed should contain the elements that will produce bone and muscle and be given in troughs clean and pure.

Dried beet pulp is considered to be a great dairy feed. It's only a short time since it was considered a waste product.

Give Cow a Vacation.

A cow should have at least six weeks' vacation between milking periods. If she is milked continually she will not last long.

Cleaning the Udder Well.

The cow's udder should be well washed and dried with coarse cloth before milking, and the milk's hands should be washed after every cow.

Making Butter.

Butter to be graded as extra must have a quick and fresh flavor. Its body must be good and uniform. The color must be good for the season when properly salted, neither gritty nor flat.

Skim Milk and Cream.

Some one that cow separators and have good herds of cows report much profit in selling cream to one class of customers and skim milk to another set. Sometimes the same customers want both the cream and skim milk. An account of the separation they pay more for each.


Spinach and Beets contain large quantities of iron, and this fact alone would seem to justify a generous consumption of them in the shape of greens by those whose blood needs toning up. Incidentally, too, when cooked with a teaspoonful of salt pork they make a mighty toothsome ration for a fellow whose blood doesn't need any tonic.

The burdock, one of the most common and useful of weeds known to every property owner, is a biennial that is, lives two years. The young plants may be killed easily with the hoe, while those that are in their second year may be put out of business by running the root through with a spade a couple of inches below the crown.

There is no recipe for cooking soft boiled eggs that gives more uniform or more satisfactory results than putting the eggs in boiling water—an egg to a pint—and allowing them to cook in a slow stream to remain from eight to ten minutes, depending a bit upon how one wants them cooked. Eggs prepared in this way are evenly cooked and are never overdone, even if forgotten and left in the water overtime.
