Teachers from Other States Speak in Praise of Polk County Educational Meeting.

The Teacher's Annual Institute for Polk County, which was held last week, was pronounced by all teachers present to be one of the best, if not the best, every held in the county. Many teachers from other states, who are recent arrivals, declared it was the best institute they had ever attended. This speaks well for Oregon.

The loyalty of the Polk County teachers was above the average, as every teacher excepting two in the county, was in attendance the entire time and always in the building on time.

The department work of the different instructors was above the average, and the lectures before the general assembly by L. R. Alderman, of Eugene and the new State Superintendent; Superintendent J. H. Ackerman, and H. A. Adrain, of Santa Barbara, California, were the best ever. All teachers returned to their schools with a greater interest in their work in the children of the county, and much good will be accomplished this year in the schools.

The primary lessons given by Miss Florence Akin of the Salem schools were just what the teachers needed and all were pleased with Miss Akin and her work. Superintendent Powers gave the teachers some solid work in Language in all of the departments and many teachers will return to their schools better prepared to teach this subject, as Superintendent Powers always delivers the goods.

Assistant State Superintendent E. F. Carlton gave four lessons on History, Literature and the Classics which were much appreciated by those in the advanced department.

State Superintendent J. H. Ackerman's address before the general assembly on "The Public Schools, a Vision of the Future" was one of the best addresses ever given before an assembly of teachers, and gave much encouragement to the teachers. The present expressed their appreciation of the excellent work Superintendent Ackerman has given the schools of Oregon the past twelve years and also for his encouragement and assistance.

When Superintendent H. C. Seymour secured Mr. H. A. Adrain, of California, for this institute, he did some of his best work for the teachers both in county, as Mr. Adrain's work both in the departments and in the general assemblies was such that all teachers and many citizens who were present demanded of Superintendent Seymour that he secure Mr. Adrain for next year if possible. Mr. Adrain is truly all that has been claimed for him, and is doing much for the education of the children of the United States.

The lecture given by Mr. Adrain on "Luther Burbank and his Wonderful Work," at the Vaudeville Theater, with the pictures of Mr. Burbank's garden and plants was a treat that does not come to many more than once in a lifetime.

Superintendent Seymour outlined the work that he is trying to have carried out by the teachers of the county this year and many schools will be improved and bettered along the lines of sanitation, ventilation, spelling, attendance, and general interest in the school work.

The committee on resolutions gave the following report which was adopted:

"To The Teacher's Association of Polk County: We, your committee on resolutions beg to submit the following:

"Resolved, that we believe in the mission of the teacher as a paramount interest to the welfare of the State, in that we begin the education of its future citizens in the public schools.

"That we believe the State ought to furnish ample opportunity for the teachers to prepare themselves for this important work.

"That we hereby express our appreciation of the most excellent instruction furnished us by Superintendent J. H. Ackerman, Mr. H. A. Adrain, and the other instructors of the institute.

"That we express our thanks hereby to the good citizens of Dallas for their kind hospitality.

"That we commend the work of our Superintendent Seymour for his untiring efforts to improve the schools of our county and we recommend that all the schools take part in the spelling contests to be held during the year, also that each teacher endeavor as far as possible to carry out the directions of Superintendent Seymour with regard to school sanitation.

"That our thanks are extended to the Board of Directors of the public schools of Dallas for the use of their school building for this meeting."

School Officers' Meeting.
The annual School Officers' Convention which was held in Dallas on Saturday was not as well attended as in the past, but over forty districts were represented and the interest was good. Had the day not been one on which every farmer thought he must work, and had it been rainy, every school district in the county would have been represented.

The convention was called to order at 10:30 a. m. by President T. W. Brunk. Mr. H. A. Adrain, of Santa Barbara, California, gave an address on "The Health of the Child and the Sanitation of the School Buildings," which was much appreciated by all present.

Many subjects of importance were discussed before the noon hour, when President Brunk, appointed the following committees on resolutions: Hon. C. L. Hawley, W. A. Wood, J. R. Macomber, Finley Edgar, and L. H. McLee.

At the session after lunch, other subjects of importance to the schools were discussed and many school boards ordered the stone tanks for the drinking water for their schools.

Superintendent J. H. Ackerman was present and gave an excellent address on school conditions of the past, present, and future.

The committee on resolutions handed in the following report, which was adopted by the convention:

organization of County School Superintendents.

"That we most heartily believe in the Normal training of all teachers, and would most earnestly urge that the state make such provision as will secure such training for such teachers.

"That this is a practical age and that the demand for the training of our children is along such lines, and we believe that there are many things which are unnecessary, and unimportant, and that we are adopting a course in Manual Training, Domestic Science and Art, and Elementary Agriculture.

"That we heartily favor the creation of a County High School Fund and urge the support at the coming election of the measure providing for such.

"That we extend to our State Superintendent, J. H. Ackerman, our heartfelt thanks and appreciation for the most excellent and untiring work he has given the schools of the state during his twelve years as State Superintendent of Public Instruction, and that we wish him the best of success in whatever field of work he may undertake."

T. W. Brunk was re-elected President of the Association, S. L. Stewart was elected Vice-President, and H. C. Seymour, Secretary.
