Farm and Garden

TILE DRAINING A FIELD.

Importance of Paying Attention to All Details of the Work.

The first and most important consideration in the draining of any field is how to secure a proper outlet. This, if possible, should have a free outfall at ways above water and so protected as never to become obstructed. If the outlet is permitted to terminate beneath water a certain section of the drain must remain continuously full of water, and under these conditions there is danger of silt depositing, closing the drain and rendering the whole system ineffective.

It should be so made as to be uninjured by freezing and not in danger of being clogged through the transpiration of animals about it. Either sewer tile or vitrified drain tile, which will not be crumbled by the action of frost, should be laid for the first fifteen or twenty feet. If neither of these are available the next best plan is to bed the drain in a good concrete in a depth of four or five inches and at the mouth build up with the concrete a protecting face sufficient to prevent the caving of earth about the outlet. It is well, too, to extend the concrete in a sloping apron two or three feet, on which the water may spill without eroding. Across the mouth of the tile there should be bedded in the concrete when it is laid a few vertical bars of half-inch iron rod to prevent the entrance of animals. The outlet may discharge into a stream or lake or into an open ditch, but in whatever place there should be no possibility of it ever being more than temporarily under water or otherwise obstructed.

Unless the fall for the drain can be very considerable its laying must be done with great care, the amount of care to secure perfectly uniform grade increasing the smaller the fall must be. To illustrate, in case the fall must

be as little as an inch in a hundred feet it is clear that an error of three inches either up or down in the proper laying of the tile might cause water to stand to a sufficient depth in the tile to practically fill one three inches in diameter, and this would cause the silting up of the tile so as in time to render the section above the error in laying entirely inefficient.

When the tile has been brought finally into place great care should be taken to turn each piece until a close joint is secured on the top and as far as possible down the side and to see that it lies solidly upon its bed before any filling is placed over it. Though earth should then be added to hold the tile firmly and prevent their becoming displaced when the final filling is done it is important that the filling or all but the final leveling should be done as early as practicable, as there is great danger from heavy rains washing soil into the drain through the joints when they are still loosely covered with only a foot or so of soil above their tops—American Agriculturist.

Orchard and Garden.

It does not pay to plant crops in the peach orchard. Some people do it, but it is generally believed to be a bad practice.

A covey of quail in an orchard will prove a good friend to the grower, because they eat a tremendous number of insects.

Carnations intended for winter blooming should not be allowed to flower. Pinch off the buds as soon as they appear.

When doing the tree planting, do not forget to put a few trees in a corner of the pasture fields if there is such a thing as a fence pasture on the farm. Protect these for a few years and they will protect the stock for many more.

The slugs may be given an effective knockout on the small cherry and peach trees by throwing a handful of two or three dust or earth over the leaves. The same plan is good for the slug that infects the rosebushes.

If the full facts were known it is more than likely that much of the benefit resulting from the application of stable manures to the soil is due to the fact that the alkalis they contain tend to correct and sweeten a somewhat sour condition of soil, as well as to the known fertilizing elements which they contain.

Those starting in the growing of chrysanthemums should keep in mind that these plants are gross consumers of plant food, need heavy fertilizing and frequent watering. If the largest measure of success is to be attained with them. Failure with this flower is sometimes due to the fact that the bed in which they are set is placed too near a hedge or shrub, which are also heavy putters on both fertility and moisture.

thirty to sixty on the average farm would be amply justified from the service they render as weed destroyers. It being a matter of statistics that of more than 500 different kinds of weeds they will consume all but about fifty varieties. Along with dairying the practice of sheep raising needs introduction in many grain raising sections of the country, while it needs reintroduction into some sections where it was once in vogue.

The northeast slope has been viewed for many years past as the ideal site for an orchard location. This seems to be due to the fact that on such locations orchards are not only exposed to the cold winds of spring, which tend to retard a development of blossom, bud and leaf, but receive much less directly the rays of the warming sun. In localities where there is never danger from spring frosts these factors are not so vital, but in latitudes where this is a recurrent danger this matter of location is an important one.

With parcels post systems in operation and beneficially so in practically all leading foreign countries, it would seem to be but a short time until such a system, or a modification of it, will be adopted in this country. Country dwellers are beginning to make insistent demand for the adoption of the plan, and this means that the professional politician who has his ear nearer to the speaking tube of the express companies than the folks out in the corn, wheat and cotton fields will have to get busy shortly if he stays in office.

An invention which gives promise of being of immense benefit to the orange packing industry has lately been installed in the plant of the Redlands Orange Growers' association. In brief, it is a device in which the fruit is subjected to an alcohol bath, the perfectly sound and solid fruit going to the bottom of the tank and the light and imperfect fruit remaining at the surface, whence it is removed by an endless conveyor. This simple device not only accomplishes what the human hand and eye cannot, but it has been found that fruit given the alcohol bath keeps longer and in a better state of preservation through a destruction of all rot spores on the surface. The cost of the operation is 15 cents per box for alcohol and 25 cents for labor.

The New York state department of agriculture has lately issued a book of some 200 pages giving descriptions of occupied and unoccupied farms to the Empire State which are for sale or rent. Doubtless such descriptions would give a prospective buyer a fair idea of these properties, but such is equally true in the purchase of lands in the west, they should not be bought without being given a careful first hand inspection. There is little question that many of these places are real bargains—price, quality of land and nearness to market considered—there are some others which would hardly justify paying a price which would equal the taxes and cost of keeping in repair. Notwithstanding this they might well be looked into carefully by those who are looking for "homes on the land."
