Good Clothes

The measure was successful, according very slowly, but the indications point to a heavy plurality for Hiram W. Johnson, the Republican gubernatorial candidate, over Theodore Bell, his Democratic opponent. Both the Call, a leading Johnson paper, and the Examiner, which waged a strong fight for Bell, place Johnson's plurality at something over 20,000. The Chronicle, which supported the Republican ticket, asserts that the returns are too incomplete to hazard an estimate.

J. Stitt Wilson, Socialist candidate for Governor, developed surprising strength in the large cities.

William Kent has been elected to Congress from the Second District by a substantial majority, and Julius Kahn and E. A. Hayes, Republican incumbents from the Fourth and Fifth districts, respectively, have been returned to the lower House.

The Panama-Pacific Exposition tax and the San Francisco fair bond amendment were ratified by a heavy vote in San Francisco and the Northern counties of the state and by a small but substantial vote in the Southern section.

The Republicans made gains in both branches of the Legislature.
