COLONISTS WILL SOON COME

Number of Homeseekers Expected to Double That of 1910. The railroads are planning to give Oregon a lot of new citizens this spring. Preparations are being made by the Harriman and Hill lines to dump just about twice as many homeseekers into this state as they did last spring, says the Portland Journal.

Commercial organizations of Portland are making ready to welcome more than 20,000 colonists and homeseekers during the colonist rate period from March 15 to April 15. Conservative estimates of the number of homeseekers that came into Oregon last spring were 15,000. E. C. Gillier, secretary of the Portland Chamber of Commerce, and W. L. Crissey, chief of the inquiry bureau, of the Portland Commercial Club, said they believed at least twice as many people looking for homes in Oregon as came last year, would swarm in this spring. Masses of inquiries form a basis for their belief. This influx of sturdy middle Westerners and Easterners is the harvest of advertising and publicity work. Most of the homeseekers, as indicated by inquiries, will come from Minnesota and other northern middle western states. New York and Pennsylvania will give their share. Oregon's attractiveness has been augmented by the low rates offered the homeseekers by the Hill lines. The cost of a ticket to Oregon cities from nearly all of the Missouri river points, from whence the greatest number of homeseekers will come, will range from \$37 to \$43. Tickets from the Atlantic Coast will be in the neighborhood of \$50.

DIES AT AGE OF 82 YEARS

Mrs. Chesley Shelton Passes at Daughter's Home in Freewater. Mrs. Chesley Shelton, a resident of Oregon since 1862, died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. C. N. White, in Freewater, Oregon, Sunday, February 12, 1911, aged 82 years.

Mrs. Shelton was a sister of the late James Morrison, and an aunt of Horatio and Wesley Morrison, of Dallas. She had many acquaintances among the older residents of Polk County, having lived in the Lockinville community about 20 years ago. She was born in Tennessee, November 5, 1828, and was married to Chesley Shelton, December 1, 1846. The family crossed the plains to Oregon in the spring of 1862. She is survived by her husband and seven children, Mrs. J. W. Kennedy, Union, Ore.; Mrs. C. W. White, Freewater; Mrs. T. M. Pine, Walla Walla; Mrs. E. G. Bowman, Baker, Ore.; J. N. Shelton, Unity, Ore.; M. C. Shelton, Paradise, and J. H. Shelton, Gardena, Wn. Speaking of the passing of this good woman, the Freewater "Times" says: "Grandma Shelton has been ill for about six weeks, hearing her suffering with Christian fortitude. Early in life she united with the Christian Church and had been a devoted member of the same throughout her whole life. The funeral took place on Monday from the Christian church in Milton, Rev. J. A. Lord, the officiating minister. Interment took place in the Old Fellows' cemetery."

FRUIT EXPERTS TO COME

TWO DAYS' HORTICULTURAL INSTITUTE IN DALLAS. Leading Authorities of State Will Give Instructions on Every Phase of Subject.

The fruit growers and farmers of Polk County are to have the opportunity this week of attending one of the most complete and interesting agricultural institutes ever arranged in the State. It will be held Thursday and Friday of this week in the Circuit Court room in the Courthouse, in Dallas, and from the great interest that is being manifested the attendance will be worthy of the occasion. The principal part of the program will be devoted to the subject of horticulture, various other matters of importance to the tiller of the soil will receive attention. The leading authorities of the state—men who have spent years in the study of the subjects upon which they have come to be considered authorities—will address the meetings upon the particular phases of fruit growing with which they are most familiar, and every branch of the subject will be touched upon, from the selection of the proper soil to the most advanced methods of marketing the product. Owing to the fact that the growing season is largely in its elementary stage here, a large portion of the instruction will be upon the points of most interest to those just starting in the business. The entire program will be comprehensive in scope, and it is aimed to be of value alike to the beginner and to the grower of more extended experience.

Need of County Society.

The need of a county horticultural society has been made apparent in many ways, and an effort will be made to take advantage of the occasion to interest as many fruit growers in the subject as possible, so as to organize such a body and to secure united and harmonious action on subjects of vital importance that need attention in this county. The meeting will open at 10:30 Thursday morning. The program will consist of addresses during the forenoon and in the evening. Friday's meeting will also begin at 10:30 a. m. and will conclude with the afternoon session. The program as arranged will be as follows:

Thursday.

10:30 a. m.—"Culture and Marketing," by Lloyd T. Reynolds, of Salem, ex-state fruit commissioner and practical orchardist. 1 p. m.—"Pruning and Spraying," by E. C. Armstrong, fruit inspector of Marion County, who has had long experience in fruit raising in Oregon and California.

"Orchard Work," by Professor C. L. Lewis, head of the department of Horticulture, of the State Experiment Station, who has a national reputation in this branch of science. He will take up the subject on a broad scale, and will give instructions on selection of soils and varieties, methods of planting, culture, pruning, grafting, picking, etc.

10:30 a. m.—"Over-production," by H. M. Williamson, secretary of the State Board of Horticulture, a thorough fruit man and an acknowledged authority in this state. 1 p. m.—"Organization of Selling Agencies," by W. K. Newell, of Gaston, president of the State Board of Horticulture, well known as a speaker on matters pertaining to horticulture.
