LATE POTATO PLANNED

Klamath Falls Ranchers Would Show What Can Be Done.

KLAMATH FALLS, May 20.—Attorney and ex-Judge George Noland, one of the principal owners of the famous Altamont Ranch, two miles south of Klamath Falls, is going to make some extensive demonstrations of late potato planting this season to prove that farmers can plant these tubers late to bar any possible chance of late spring frosts catching them.

Klamath County is noted for its fine spuds. Thousands of bushels are grown here annually, but an occasional year the early planted ones are caught and badly damaged.

Judges are permitted to parole prisoners not previously convicted of a felony. Applications to set aside a judgment must be heard and determined within 60 days.

NEW LAWS IN EFFECT

Increasing the membership of the university regents.

Reimbursing the O. N. G. \$16,000.63 for compensation and expenses in fighting forest fires.

Private insane asylums to be licensed by County Courts.

Protection of women from "white slavery." Law similar to that of the Federal Government.

Exempting money belonging to insane Asylum patients who have died or eloped.

Appropriating \$25,000 a year for cooperation with the United States Government in making topographic maps and investigating water resources.

Appropriating \$4000 for a burial lot in Riverview cemetery, Portland, for deceased soldiers of the Spanish-American war.

Protecting Societies.

Protecting secret and fraternal societies from fraud and impostors and declaring it unlawful to use the name of an order to which a person does not belong.

Boys under age of 18 years cannot be employed as engineers or in giving signals in logging operations.

Children infested with vermin, or unclean can be prohibited from attending school.

Assignees of claims against any county or city officer shall not have the right to institute suit for recovery except on taxes or license.

Per capita tax for the county school fund shall not be less than the per capita of school tax for the county in 1917.

County Courts are authorized to appropriate money not to exceed \$2000 for Agricultural College.

District attorneys are to make defense in divorce cases when defendant does not appear or defend in good faith.

Salaries of County Commissioners raised to \$150 a month.

Appropriation of \$70,000 annually for Agricultural College.

Appropriation of \$273,000, available for improvements at the Agricultural College.

Rehabilitating and unjust discrimination by railroads prohibited.

Yagrazney law of the city of Portland extended to the counties. It will enable sheriffs to deal with the hobos.

Accidents to Laborers.

Employers of labor must report to the Commissioner of Labor all accidents to laborers, which list must be compiled and published.

Incorporated cities may appropriate land outside the limits needed for sewers and water mains.

The Salem, Falls City & Western Railroad is authorized to build a bridge across the Willamette river at Salem.

Judges are permitted to parole prisoners not previously convicted of a felony.

Applications to set aside a judgment must be heard and determined within 60 days.

County roads within the corporate limits of Falls City are dedicated as city streets.

A State Purchasing Board is created consisting of the Governor, Secretary of State and Treasurer, who are to purchase all supplies for the state institutions.

A secretary is allowed at a salary of \$2500 a year. An appropriation of \$7500 is made to carry out the provisions of the act.

A State Parole Board is created, to consist of three people, one of whom shall be the superintendent of the penitentiary. This board is to recommend paroles of prisoners under an indeterminate sentence.

Certified copies of deeds can be made when the originals are lost.

Thinking on Trains.

Drinking intoxicating liquors on trains is prohibited.

Train employees must not be worked more than 14 hours. Dispatchers and operators are limited to nine hours.
