NO CAUSE FOR ALARM.

H. V. Gates, the well-known Hillsboro capitalist and a close observer of financial conditions, expresses the opinion that whatever business depression may exist throughout the country is temporary in its nature.

In an interview published in the Hillsboro Independent, Mr. Gates says that during his trip he repeatedly heard the prediction that after the presidential election is over, business will resume its activity and the country will experience an era of unparalleled prosperity.

Mr. Gates' observation was confined to Eastern states and he would venture no opinion as to Pacific Coast affairs, saying he had been too long absent.

An item in the news columns conveys the information that the home demand for lumber this year exceeds that of any previous year and that increased local trade has led to a large measure of compensation for the falling off in long-distance shipments.

The ex-president furnishes a fine tribute to the intelligence and nobility of the United States Government in this whole Mexican trouble.
