The people of the little town of Dallas are thoroughly aroused over the Magors affair, and the sentiment in favor of hanging him without the formality of any legal proceedings is strong.

The attempt of a leading suffragist in Seattle, to recall Mayor Dilling because he would not discharge a janitor of the city jail, has failed utterly. In the first place the business interests of the city lined up against the movement, and in a strongly worded petition, implored the people of the city not to countenance the effort to recall the Mayor by signing the petition, characterizing it as a piece of spite work and against the best interests of the city to encourage the strife and turmoil sure to result from another recall campaign.

It appears that "yellow journalism" is not confined to the larger cities of the country.

PRESIDENT TAFT VINDICATED.

Failure of the combination of democrats and their republican insurgent allies to pass the wool bill over President Taft's veto and his victory on the statehood bill by the elimination of the recall feature as applied to judges, demonstrates once more the ability of President Taft to win his own victories even in the face of an opposing political majority.

So far as the statehood bill is concerned, no valid objections could be urged against the admission of these Southern territories. President Taft, himself, was unqualifiedly in favor of their admission and the republican party was pledged to that policy.
