PENSION ACTION URGED

Old Soldiers and Sailors of Polk County Will Ask Congress For Necessary Legislation.

An enthusiastic meeting of the Polk County Soldiers' and Sailors' Association was held in the court house Saturday which was well attended by veterans from different parts of the county. President A. J. Martin, in calling the session to order, stated that the object was to take some action on one of the various pension bills now before congress.

A communication from Congressman Hawley was read. He expressed his regret at being unable to be present, but gave his assurance that he would do all in his power to further the interests of the association in the matter of pension legislation at the coming session of congress.

A letter was read from the adjutant general's department of Oregon giving instructions as to the manner of procedure in presenting the case.

Favor Sherwood Bill.
A resolution was unanimously adopted favoring the Sherwood bill, if amended as proposed by the last national encampment of the Grand Army of the Republic, at Rochester, New York, and Secretary Lovelace was asked to forward a copy of the resolution to each of the senators and representatives in congress from this state.

A committee was appointed to draft a constitution and by-laws for the association, and consists of Numa Arnold, of Dallas; J. R. More, of Falls City; W. P. Fisher, of Monmouth; Levi Kosier, of Riekroall; B. Lovelace, of Dallas.

The next meeting will be held sometime in December, the date to be decided upon later.

BREEDERS STOP FIGHT

Damage Suit Between W. J. Domes and W. C. Morrow Over Prize Award is Withdrawn.

Announcement is made that the damage suit between W. J. Domes and W. C. Morrow, two prominent breeders of fine Jersey cattle in this county, has been withdrawn from the courts. The matter was first drawn to the attention of the public May 2, 1911, when W. J. Domes, of McCoy, brought suit against W. C. Morrow, of Riekroall, for damages to the amount of \$5000 and costs and disbursements of the action, for alleged injury to his reputation and business.

Tenor of Complaint.
According to the complaint, the basis for action was an article charged to have been written by Morrow and published in the Rural Spirit newsing Domes of "crooked work" in connection with awarding of premiums at the state fair in the fall of 1910, when they both had fancy stock on exhibition in the cattle show.

La Chance was arrested and taken to McMinnville where he will await trial. He is charged with carrying weapons and for disorderly conduct. Mrs. Dudley was taken to Willamina where her wound was dressed.
