

COLLEGE EXPERT TO HELP MANAGE SCHOOL FAIRS

Agricultural Education Will be Personally Conducted in Every Oregon County Now.

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, Or., Jan. 23.—The organization of school industrial fairs and the promotion of agricultural education in the schools throughout the state will be the principal work of Calvin C. Thomason, who was made a member of the staff of the Oregon Agricultural Extension division under Professor R. D. Hetzel at the last meeting of the college regents.

Under the immediate direction of State Superintendent of Schools L. R. Alderman, Mr. Thomason will visit the various counties, aiding the school authorities in organizing the industrial work and promoting the school fairs and school gardens. The work is a part of that planned by the State Bankers' association and promoted by the Oregon Development league, the State Fair association, the State Superintendent of Schools and the agricultural college.

Since his graduation in 1907 at Whitman college, Mr. Thomason has been in journalistic work in various parts of the state, notably at La Grande, Pendleton, Salem, and Portland, and has done much toward better farm methods and the improvement of rural conditions generally.

ENJOYS FLORIDA'S CLIMATE

Former Polk County Resident Tells of Weather in Southland.

The following letter from A. H. Dodd, a former clergyman, of Falls City, will be of interest to his many Polk county friends:

Hall City, Florida, January 10, 1912. Editor Observer:—"Thinking some of my old Polk county friends would like to hear something about Christmas in Southern Florida, I will briefly say that on Christmas day my family and I joined a party of 37 who went for a few days' outing on Flash creek, about six miles north. The bright sunshine, the temperature of about 80 degrees in the shade, and the sight of barefooted children wading in the water made it seem more like Fourth of July. The only thing suggestive of a Northern Christmas was that the white sand in the road looked like snow.

The day was spent picking flowers, hunting, fishing, frying fish and boiling coffee over a camp fire, a dinner on the ground in the shade of a big live oak tree and kodaking. Three other men and the writer went in swimming where the stream was 30 yards wide and over head deep, and found the water pleasantly warm—warmer than Polk county water gets at any time.

Will only add that last Sunday the thermometer registered 78 degrees in the shade at 3 o'clock p. m. Our tomato, cabbage and potato plants from seed planted in November are making fine growth and are now looking about as such things would appear in Polk county about the first of July.
