DECLARES HIMSELF A CANDIDATE

CAPTAIN TOOZE WOULD LIKE TO BE STATE REPRESENTATIVE.

Asks For Nomination on Republican Ticket at Primary Election—Announces Platform Adopted.

Captain Walter L. Tooze, Jr., has just announced his intention of becoming a candidate for the nomination of state representative on the republican ticket at the coming primary election to be held April 19. Having made the declaration, it is expected that he will enter the race with the accustomed vigor which has characterized his official and business career in this city. At the present time, Captain Tooze is city attorney, a position he has held for the past three years. Prior to that he served as city attorney for Falls City for two years, resigning to come here. He is also secretary of the Dallas Commercial club, and as such is thoroughly conversant with the conditions of the city and county. In addition, he is captain of the local Company G, Third Regiment of the Oregon National Guard of which he has been an active booster.

Captain Tooze was born in Butteville, Marion county, February 24, 1887. He graduated from the law department of the University of

Michigan, at Ann Arbor, one of the most famous schools of the country, in June 1908. In September of the following year he came to Dallas and began the practice of law, and has been closely identified with the business life of the city ever since.

Platform Announced.
In announcing his candidacy, Captain Tooze makes the following statement of his position on important questions of the day:

"I believe in the direct primary; a reasonable use but no abuse of the Initiative and Referendum. I believe United States senators should be elected direct by the people, but further believe there should be National Legislation to this effect. Am in favor of legislation tending to reduce the taxes. Believe a law should be enacted that will either abolish the tax upon mortgages, or else deduct the amount of a mortgage from the assessed value of the land upon which the mortgage is a lien, and then assess the tax upon the value of the land less the amount of the mortgage and assess the mortgage. In this way the tax would be paid but once. The way it is now, the mortgagor pays taxes upon the full value of his land, he is also compelled to pay taxes upon the mortgage, for the mortgagee in fixing the rate of interest upon the loan sees to that. Many counties disregard the present law entirely; but I believe in the enforcement of all laws, and officials of this county are to be congratulated upon their observance of the law. It is for the Legislature to relieve the people of the injustice. If a man owns land worth \$2000; there is a mortgage upon it for \$1000 to him, the land is only worth \$1000 and he should not be assessed for more."

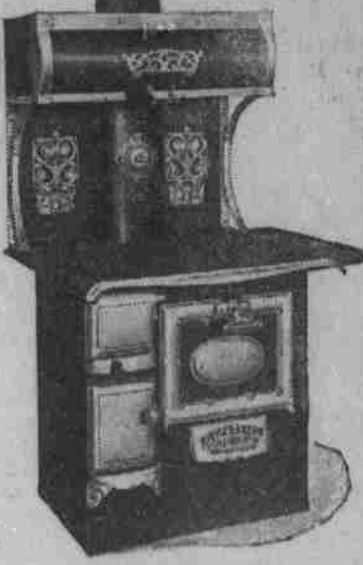
