SHOW PRISON PICTURES

Star Theater to Display Scenes in Connection With Salem Penitentiary and Governor's Honor System

The manner in which the Oregon penitentiary is being conducted under Governor West is causing much excited discussion pro and con all over the United States, and even in Europe. Leading magazines of the East—the Outlook for one—have sent special representatives to this state to investigate, and the Oregon prison is continually in the limelight of the newspapers. Even the people of England have become familiar with Governor West's prison policy, through the discussions of this subject by the great London dailies.

The motion picture houses, too, have taken up the matter, and recently a series of splendid pictures has been prepared, covering all interesting phases of convict life in the Oregon prison—from the receipt of the prisoner at the station in Salem, by Warden Curtis, to the convict's final liberation.

Elmo S. White, well known locally, has these pictures in charge, and will show them throughout the East. Before starting on the extended trip, however, they will be shown at the Star Theater in Dallas, Friday night only, April 26.

TO SAFEGUARD HUMAN LIFE

Railway Company Adopt Appliances to Protect Employees.

San Francisco, April 25.—The Southern Pacific company has entered upon a vigorous campaign for the increasing of the safety of its passengers and its employees. Orders have gone out that no more wooden coaches shall be constructed. Special side levers have been provided for the uncoupling of cars, so that any two cars may be disconnected without the brakeman getting between and endangering his life. All of the cars are now equipped with automatic couplers so that it is not now necessary for the brakeman to be even near the cars, the impact causing them to couple.

Meetings are held regularly at all important points between the employees and officials, and new methods of operation that provide for the safety of the trainmen and passengers are discussed. Additional block signals are being installed all the time and accidents on the railroad will soon be a rarity. Many other safety devices that will benefit both the passengers and the employee are being investigated and installed if found feasible.

MELON OUTPUT TO BE LARGE

Fifty Million Cantaloupes Will Be Raised in Imperial Valley.

Los Angeles, April 24.—The growers of cantaloupes in the Imperial valley, California, estimate this season's production at 50,000,000 melons. Approximately 5,500 acres have been planted this spring, the yield, under normal conditions being computed at 50,000,000 melons, about 1,000,000 crates, or 2,600 carloads. At least 30,000 tons of ice will be required for the shipping of this fruit to the markets of the country. The Southern Pacific, which handles practically all of this crop, is already beginning to assemble its refrigerator cars in that section.

To get the melons to their various destinations in good condition necessitates considerable skill in packing the crates cantaloupes inside the cars. In addition to seeking an attractive appearance in the arrangement of the fruit in the car, which appeals to the car-lot buyer when he inspects it at its destination, the shipper must see to it that the crates are securely fastened to prevent them from shifting and to see that they are loaded and packed as to allow free ventilation and refrigeration.
