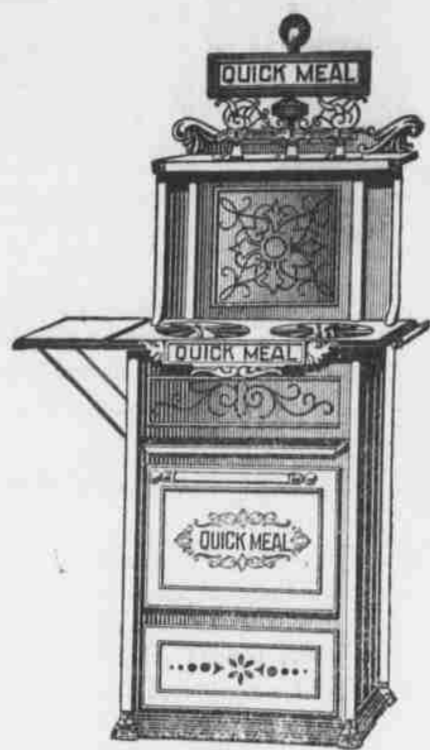

PEDAGOGY CALLS THEM

Teaching Profession Lures Most of Recent Graduates of High School and College; One to Be Good Cook.

School days are over for most of the graduates of the high schools and colleges, and each student feels that his or her ability in a chosen vocation will enable them to make a success of it.

Miss Edna Shore, a graduate of 1912 in pedagogy from Dallas College, will teach in the Liberty district, southwest of the city.

Of the High School graduates, Miss Olive Coulter will probably attend the Oregon Agricultural College next year, where she will take up a domestic science course. "I do not expect to fit myself for a lawyer, or an author, or anything really distinguished, but I do want to be a good cook," said Miss Coulter.

Miss Letitia Shewey, valedictorian of the class of 1912, is planning to teach school, but has not yet secured a position for the winter.

Miss Anna Garner will have charge of the rural school at Polk Station.

Miss Lillian Fellowes will attend a business college in Portland and will probably resume her studies in elocution from an expert instructor.

"I want to teach next winter," said Miss Ballard. "But I have not decided just where. After next year I am going to the State University, and hope to complete my education there."

Miss Georgia Fiske has an ambition to become a stenographer. She is not decided, however, and may attend Willamette University to complete her literary course before taking up her studies in short hand and typewriting.

CONTRACT IS ANNULLED.

Oregon Road Oiling Company
Notified Nothing Doing on Dallas Streets.

Owing to the dilatoriness of the Oregon Road Oiling company, to whom was awarded a contract for oiling the streets of the city, it is probable that the contract will be cancelled and the company notified to that effect. The contract provided, it is said, that the work must be begun by June 15 and completed by June 25, and in a letter written the company the first of the week by City Recorder Gregory, under instructions from the council, the company was notified that work must begin by June 20. The recent heavy rains have placed the streets in such condition that the work could not possibly be completed by the date provided in the contract and, as the season is well advanced, it has been thought best to annul all negotiations for this year.
