Ninety-First Birthday.

A reception was held from 2 o'clock until 5 o'clock and many relatives and friends called to pay their respects to the venerable pioneer who has spent 68 years in Oregon. In 1849 Rev. Ramsdell preached on the Dallas circuit and since that time he has been a resident of the city. His son C. C. Ramsdell of this city, his grandson Lawrence Ramsdell of Dallas, and his great grandson Oscar Ramsdell, of Dallas.

Auction Sale of Cattle.

The sale of dairy cattle to be held during the Pacific International Dairy show at Portland, November 18-23, will be attractive to many of our rymen throughout the state. From 200 to 400 cattle will be put up at a combination auction sale, all of high class and subject to the tuberculosis test by experts at the show free of charge. Reassure prices are promised. The stock will come from the many leading breeders in different parts of the country and will include all the dairy strains.

Promote Salt Industry.

Oregon will soon be producing large quantities of salt. Development work on Summer and Abert lakes has been started and it is expected to produce 400,000 tons per year of salt, potash and soda. There are said to be 40,000,000 tons of salt in these lakes and a 40-year lease has been secured. More salt than is taken from Salt Lake, Utah is expected to be secured annually from these Oregon waters.

To Aid Farmers.

By way of aiding the farmer and adding to his success, the Salem Board of Trade is maintaining a farm management expert in connection with the Department of Agriculture. This is the first such work undertaken by a commercial body west of the Rocky mountains. The expert investigates farming conditions in the Salem territory and advises farmers on all agricultural questions.

Convention of Police Women.

The first convention of Police women ever held in the United States has just taken place at Portland. Women connected with the police departments of Northwestern cities met to consider problems constantly coming up, such as the prevention of delinquency among the young, treatment of women prisoners, care of jails, reformatories, etc.

Mrs. Genevieve Penton who died at her home in Portland Saturday, October 26, was the wife of Dr. M. F. Penton, brother of Lee Penton of this city. She was a sister of Walter Larson who will be remembered by Dallas people as former manager of the Grand theater. Mr. and Mrs. Lee Penton left for Portland Monday to attend the funeral which was held from the residence Monday afternoon.

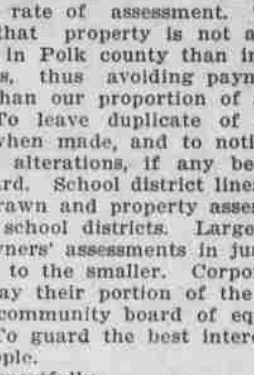
Having received the Republican nomination for Assessor, I respectfully ask your support for my election November 5. My principles are:
