Independence Going Forward.

The efforts on the part of the city
council to establish more street
paving in Independence have seemed to
create a little dissatisfaction among
citizens in but a few instances, says
the Enterprise. This is not among the
unusual occurrences, however,
when men endeavor to promote their
own and their neighbors' interests by
introducing some public or civic en-
terprise. Some men are apparently
contented to traverse muddy streets
and enjoy an isolated appearance of
a city. These conditions have exist-
ed in Independence too long.

In the opinion of the writer, the
only mistake the city council has
made is in its neglect to start the
wheels of progress sooner. But it
takes time for great bodies to move.
Now that the movement has been
started the officials should receive the
hearty encouragement of every
citizen and especially everyone whose
property and whose interests will be
benefitted by more street improve-
ment.

We have only to look back a little
more than a year to see what the re-
sult of street improvements will do
for the city's future.

Before the business section of In-
dependence was paved the city was

comparatively dormant. Today the
entire Northwest is looking at the
city's progress with wonder and ad-
miration. Therefore it is essential
that we encourage such civic im-
provements as will bring certain ben-
eficial results.
