The United States Civil Service commission announces an examination to be held on August 20-21, 1913, in various cities throughout the United States for teacher, industrial teacher and assistant in the Philippine service.

From the eligible list thus secured appointments will be made during the coming spring for service in the Philippine Islands beginning with the opening of schools next year.

The service require women for home economics; men for agriculture, manual training, high school science, mathematics, English, history, and supervisors of school districts.

Chautauqua Program Includes 20 Soloists in Various Companies.

Lovers of good music are going to have a fine time in the Chautauqua this summer.
