FRUIT DRIERS NEEDED

Dayton Grower Tells of Modern Equipment.

Throughout Polk county, and in fact, throughout the entire Willamette valley berry raisers are beginning to realize the necessity of commodious fruit driers, and it seems hardly probable at this time that the vast quantity of loganberries raised in the vicinity of Dallas will receive proper attention.

Relative to the new evaporator, the building counting the basement, is three stories 50x60, four arches, 2200 trays, cost between \$6500 and \$7000. He thinks it has a capacity of from 35 to 40 acres of loganberries. It has a receiving building also about the same size excepting it is one story and basement which I am inclined to believe is included in the cost as he gave it.

GOOD BEEF IN DEMAND

Market in Portland Shows Sharp Decline; Dehorning Strongly Urged; Hog Market Takes Drop.

Union Stock Yards, Portland, Aug. 4.—Heavy receipts of cattle for the week, and in fact that the best stuff was not offering has caused the market to decline from 25c to 50c. Good choice stuff is in demand and would still bring a good price, but there is no demand for poor quality, which just demoralizes the market.

The hog market has dropped from 10 cents to \$9.70 for best light swine and will probably go lower, as packers needs are temporarily supplied.

PREPARING FOR ALFALFA. If the plot chosen for the alfalfa field is not well supplied with fertility it should be given a dressing of from eight to ten tons of barnyard manure per acre, and the lime can be applied with the manure if convenient.
